ISLAMABAD (APP): President Dr Arif Alvi on Tuesday gave his assent to the Maternity and Pater-nity Leave Bill, 2023.

Under the Bill, the women employees of the public and private departments under administrative control of the Federal Government will be entitled to avail maternity leave with full pay for three times during service - 180 days for first time, 120 days for second time and 90 days for third time.

Similarly, the male employees will be entitled to avail paternity leave of 30 days only for three times.

In case of violation. imprisonment of up to 6 months or fine of up to Rs 100,000 or both can be imposed.





Rescue teams race to find missing sub, with 2 Pakistan on board, near Titanic wreck

ISLAMABAD (Online): The US Coast Guard said late on Monday that its search for a missing submersible vessel, with two Pakistanis on board, near the Titanic wreck had been completed for the day but that a national guard unit and the company operating the five-passenger underwater mission would continue scouring the surface overnight.

The 21-foot craft, operated by OceanGate Expeditions, began its descent on Sunday but lost contact with the surface less than two hours later, according to authorities.

The US Coast Guard said it had launched two planes to survey the remote area in the North Atlantic, while its Canadian counterparts had also sent a plane and a ship.

But with no reported sightings of the vessel or communication signals throughout the day, the US Coast Guard's Bostonbased unit said in a tweet around 9:00pm (0100 GMT on Tuesday) that its flights for the day "have been completed"

The Polar Prince and Rescue 106 will continue to

aircraft, which had been using buoys to scan underneath the surface, will continue Tuesday morning, it Businessman Shahzada

Dawood and his son, Suleman, were also on board, their family said in a statement. The statement said the father and son had planned the journey to visit the remnants of the Titanic shipwreck.

Shahzada is the vice chairman of one of Pakistan's largest conglomerates, Engro Corporation, which has investments in fertilisers, vehicle manufacturing, energy and digital technologies.

According to the website of SETI, the California-based research institute of which he is a trustee, he lives in Britain with his wife and two chil-

In a statement, Engro corporation said that all it knew was that contact was

do surface searches lost with the submersible craft. "There is limited information available beyond this that we know, and we humbly request that speculation and theorisation is avoided," the company said.

"We, at Engro, remain in prayer for their swift and safe return, and will share updates we may have as and when they come," it added.

Another one of the passengers has been identified as British businessman Hamish Harding, whose aviation business had posted on social media about his expedition.

"It is a challenge to conduct a search in that remote area, but we are deploying all available assets to make sure that we can locate the craft and rescue the people on board," US Coast Guard Rear Admiral John Mauger told reporters in Boston, where he was overseeing the opera-

Time is a critical factor. The vessel has a range of 96 hours for the crew of five, and Mauger said on Monday afternoon he believed it still had 70 or more hours of remaining oxygen.

Remembering Shaheed Benazir Bhutto's Legacy

Sixteen years after the martyrdom of Mohtarma Benazir Bhutto, "Zinda hai BB, zinda hai" still echoes in political rallies and every day, in the hearts of her party-workers. I often think that indeed, Shaheed BB still lives in our thoughts and memories. Every year, June 21 is marked as her birthday and cakes are cut to pay tribute to this phenomenal woman, who was the pride of Pakistan nationally and internationally. Despite a known threat to her life, she chose to return to her people for the sake of democracy and rule of law. Her sacrifice will be remembered in the history of Pakistan forever as part of Bhutto family's irrefutable contribution towards the restoration

During her tenure as the Prime Minister, she created employment opportunities and helped numerous people who had nowhere else to turn to. She even financially supported needy people from personal charity, such as the caretaker of Pak Tea House, which was a space of freedom where political, intellectual and artistic culture flourished. Today, all those whose lives she touched remember her with deep respect. Shaheed BB is an example of a true leader who stays alive in the hearts of the people long after leaving this world. Her generosity is also evident in her ideology of reconciliation instead of revenge.

Today, this legacy of respect in politics should be a lesson for everyone about promoting a culture of tolerance in politics. There are countless instances from the life of Shaheed BB that are a testimony to her courage and



struggles for democracy. She never gave in to the pressures of the military regime and firmly stood by her ideologies, almost as an article of faith— she protected her vision with her life. On 14 January 1984, Shaheed BB reached Heathrow airport in London after five years of jail and house-arrest where she received a very warm welcome from her supporters. On this occasion, she spoke to the media and said, "Pakistan is my homeland. I will live and die there. I have come to Britain to seek medical treatment. In Zia's martial law, I stayed in confinement for five years and now I am breathing freely in a free country. After consultation with party leaders here. I will decide on the future course of action. Pakistan People's Party does not belong to any single individual but it belongs to the people of Pakistan. I will return to Pakistan as soon as my treat-ment ends." After the surgery of her ear, she increased the intensity of her struggle against the Zia regime in London.

Only a few days after arriving in London, I received a call from Sanam Bhutto that BB was looking for me. Shaheed BB asked me if I wanted to work with her as her spokesperson. I was humbled by this proposal and accepted. I responded that I would try my best to do justice to this position. It was her guidance that taught me a lot and gave me a fulfilling mission in life.

The international media gave a voice to her struggle for democracy on the world stage. A newspaper from Denmark introduced Shaheed BB in these words, "Who knew that a graduate of Harvard and Oxford, tall, slender and sophisticated 'Princess of the East', would become a symbol of unity for the people of Pakistan?"

Whenever she spoke about her struggles against the oppression of the military regime, there were never tears in


her eyes and she never wallowed in self-pity. When she would talk about her time in jail, she always remembered her party workers awaiting punishment in the Pakistani jails. She never forgot the need to fight for her people, staying true to the legacy of her father, Shaheed Zulfikar Ali Bhutto. She said that we have to end this autocracy and if this can be achieved by her going to jail then she would do it again and again. She raised her voice for a democratic Pakistan on multiple forums internationally and helped to establish a strong base for the Pakistan People's Party around the globe.

In 1986, she rendered everyone speechless when during a television interview she said that despite the oppressive tactics of General Zia, she would not resort to politics of revenge. The TV anchor repeated his question and asked that despite the fact that Zia hanged her father and kept her in jail, she will not take revenge? She replied she did not believe in revenge and this was the difference between Zia

On 10 April 1986, when BB landed in Lahore, she asked me to exit first and see the situation regarding police behaviour. The area was surrounded by police and along with some other party leaders, I became a part of the historic welcome procession that reached Minar-e-Pakistan for a jalsa. In the general elections of 1988, the victory of the Pakistan People's Party was a watershed moment when democracy won against terror and oppression. Shaheed BB became the first woman Prime Minister in the Muslim World, a proud moment for everyone who supported a progressive and democratic Pakistan.

Shaheed BB had clearly decided that she would not resort to any vengeful acts against the widow of General Zia or his family. She instructed her party workers as well to maintain an attitude of respect towards their rivals. She set a unique example for the future political leaders of our country, staying true to her great political stature, by forgiving her rivals. Her legacy is a lesson that verbal or physical abuse, personally maligning opponents or other modes of vengeance should be discouraged by political leaders. They should remember the conduct of Shaheed BB and refrain from stooping low to the level of common ruffians.

As I look back, I recall aspects of BB's personality that I was fortunate to witness personally. Her generous and empathetic nature is evident from her behaviour with others. She regularly celebrated my birthday until December 2007, the year she passed away, and now only her memories are left behind. In an international conference in Portugal, she was paid tribute in these words, "Amongst all the stars in the sky, you alone are the shining star. Only if Shaheed BB were alive today, the radiance of her generous personality and political brilliance would have lit our country on the world map many years ago. On this occasion of Shaheed Benazir Bhutto's birthday, let's remember this great political leader and her legacy of selflessness, respect, and steadfastness on her ideology for her land where the tree of democracy is flourishing today, nourished with the blood of Bhuttos.

Bangladesh has remarkably imp-roved its early warning and evacuation systems. A functional and effective governance system is better able to respond to disasters.

À contrasting example is that of Myanmar, where Cyclone Nargis caused 140,000 deaths and affected some 2.5m people in 2008. Although Nargis had been forecast a week before it struck, due to the government's slackness, the warning was not conveyed to the vulnerable communities in time.

EQ, based on social intelligence, is the capacity to comprehend, utilise and regulate one's emotions in constructive ways to reduce stress, communicate effectively, empathise with others, overcome problems, and diffuse disputes. Research also tells us about the 'curse of emotion', whereby individuals with a high EQ might arouse negative feelings. However, rational individuals with higher EQ fare better than those who are emotionally attached to an opinion or ideology.

ing theories stress EQ-responsive curricula, instruction, assessment and learning environments to promote holistic development, including self-awareness, among the students. Selfawareness depends on the level of mental autonomy, objective self-analysis, and decision-making abilities, with teachers and parents as support. However, schools and homes tend to promote the memorisation of specific knowledge, without considering the students' interests or potential. What can only be called 'instructional policing' demands obedience from the students and often results in physical or emotional abuse, if the young learners take no interest or resist. Meanwhile, parents want to fulfil their own dreams through their children's education.

A creative, imaginative youngster, though possessing memorisation powers, may do very well in some areas but may not get good grades in an exam. evaluation model, measuring students, with varying abilities, against fixed knowledge standards. There is nothing holistic about the teaching approach that supports such tests. In fact, assessments must go beyond merely quantifying what has been learnt; it must also highlight areas for development for both students and teachers. Regrettably, teachers rely on syllabus completion and memorised material to set exam questions. As a student, I recall having to rote learn many 'answers'. So I had no idea what I was reciting in front of my teachers or why one student was praised while the other was punished. We must prioritise

learning keeping our youngsters' EQ in mind. This could be done through an enabling atmosphere instead of being made to face pressure to deliver 'A' or A'-plus grades. Schools must be made aware of their students' talents and adapt their teaching methods accordingly, rather than subjecting them to homogenous teaching methodologies and rote learning-based assessments, which can never

The rep-ression of inquiry Standardised tests in the name of obedience stifles the courage and curiosity of children and causes them emotional harm. The curricula, teachers and parents expect obedience, which essentially means executing an action on the orders of an authority to maintain a show of respect. Teachers and parents are the people closest to children, but they are also people from whom children hide a lot of things. Respect is a two-way street — between teachers and students, and between parents and children. Updated scientific research tells us that the students' reflective learning experiences indicate an increase in self-introspection, emotional awareness, emotional regulation and understanding others. Moving from homogeneous expectations to multiple intelligences is the most effective approach. We can achieve this by allowing adequate space for new modes of learning that stimulate our children's intellectual capital rather than memory, therefore preparing pupils for life than just for exams. MOSCOW: Russia is not worried about potential U.S. attempts to influence China's policy towards Moscow, the Kremlin said on Tuesday, commenting on U.S. Secretary of State Anthony Blinken's visit to Beijing where he held talks with Chinese President Xi

During a rare visit to Beijing by Blinken, China and the United States agreed on Monday to stabilise their intense rivalry so it did not veer into conflict, but failed to produce any major breakthrough. Blinken said how-ever that he had asked the China talks causing prob-lems for Moscow, he said.

Chinese government to be very vigilant about the possibility that Chinese firms may be providing Russia with technology that it could use in its war in Ukraine, something Moscow calls a "special mili-

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said that Beijing had the sovereign right to forge ties with other countries and that the process of trying to build predictable relations between China and the United States was an important one. Russia did not think there was a risk of U.S.-

"Our strategic partnership relationship with China make us confident that (Beijing's) development of relations with other countries will never be aimed against our country, Peskov said.

Islamic State affiliate expanding reach in DR Congo, UN experts say

Monitoring Desk KINSHASA: A Ugandan armed group that killed dozens of school children last week is expanding its operations in Democratic Republic of Congo with funding from Islamic State, a United Nations group of

experts said on Tuesday. The Allied Democratic Forces (ADF) started as an uprising in Uganda but has been based in neighbouring Congo since the late 1990s. It pledged allegiance to Islamic State in 2019.

The ADF killed at least 37 people in an attack on a school in western Uganda near the Congolese border on Friday night.

Despite a joint operation against it by the Congolese and Ugandan armies, the ADF has sent scouts and fighters to plan attacks hundreds of kilometres beyond its normal area of operations in eastern Congo, the experts said in a report to the U.N. Security Coun-

cil. "In North Kivu, Operation Shuja had an impact on the sanctioned armed group. Nonetheless, ADF pursued expansion beyond North Kivu and Ituri provinces and continued to conduct deadly attacks on civilians," the report said.

The ADF has in-

creased its activity in South Kivu province in recent months and sought to recruit and conduct attacks in capital Kinshasa and in Haut-Uele province, it said. "It should be noted

that (their) objective is to carry out acts of terror that make big publicity, Congo's government spokesperson Patrick Muyaya told a press brief-

ing on Monday. He said the army was making progress against the ADF through its joint operations with Uganda, particularly in the group's strongholds where it has destroyed training centres and other sites

UNICEF warns of food shortages at overcrowded Haiti camp

PORT-AU-PRINCE: Haitian children face a severe lack of food, medical support and education, the head of the United Nation's children's agency UNICEF said in the capital Port-au-Prince on Monday, hours after heavy shooting rang out near a packed camp of displaced persons.

Heavily armed gangs have expanded their turf and now control communities accounting for some two million people, according to U.N. estimates, mostly women and children living amid frequent extra-judicial killings and sexual violence.

This has fueled a humanitarian crisis the agency believes has internally displaced over 165,000 people, while driving many to attempt a dangerous escape by boat.
"Children are mal-

nourished, they need help and the world needs to pay attention," UNICEF Executive Director Catherine Russell said in an interview after visiting the New Church of God of Deliverance camp, which now harbors 120 families from hard-

hit neighborhoods, including 239 children.

The children desperately need healthcare like immunizations, and schooling, she added: "Adults need to stop fighting and take care of children.

"We hope we won't be hosting any more kids because there is no more room," said Stephanie Pierre, who manages the crowded camp that serves as a mobile clinic distributing sanitation kits and information about cholera. At a meeting on Haiti last week, Russell said UNICEF has documented an unprecedented 30% increase in Haitian children suffering from severe wasting from last year, making them far more vulnerable to dying from cholera,

which reemerged in October.

The agency estimates over 100,000 children are at immediate risk of starving to death, out of total estimated population of around 12 million. "The time for action is long overdue," said Russell ahead of a July summit of European, Caribbean and Latin American states she described as an opportunity for the world "to rally around


