#### Much-needed & much-awaited Green Bus Service set to be launched in Quetta today

Independent Report QUETTA: The much-needed and long-awaited Green Bus Service is going to be launched

from today (Monday). According to the provincial Transport Department, all the necessary arrangements have been made to start the Green Bus Service from today.

The formal inauguration of the Green Bus Service is scheduled to be made at 12:00 Noon at the Balochistan University of Information Technology, Engineering and Management Sciences (BUITEMS) Takato campus, Baleli.

As per programme, the inauguration of Green Bus Service would be done by an ordinary passenger travelling on the local public transport, as already announced by the Chief Minister Balochistan, Mir Abdûl Quddus Bizenjo in a tweet on his social

media account Twitter. Initially, the Green Bus Service would be operated between Baleli to University of Balochistan. In all eight big and small green buses would be plied on the route, which would have 18 stopovers between its route on one side.

While a Green Bus would have the seating capacity of 60 passengers, the small buses would be 40-seated.

The fare for a passenger has been fixed as Rs. 30 in the Green buses, the sources of Provincial Transport department informed. According to the Information Department, the special seating arrangement has

been made for the women and elderly persons in the Green Buses. It is also believed that the Green Bus Service would help reduce the flow of traffic in

the provincial metropolis.

While on the other hand, the middle class segment would have the modern transport facility with the launch of Green Bus Service in Quetta.

At some middle and high ion stimulants for attention deficit hyperactivity disorder during the year prior, a new study found. "This is the first national study to look at the nonmedical use of prescription stimulants by students in middle and high school, and we found a tremendous, wide range of misuse," said lead author Sean Esteban McCabe, director of the Center for the Study of Drugs, Alcohol, Smoking and Health at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor.

"In some schools there was little to no misuse of stimulants, while in other schools more than 25% of students had used Connecticut.

ISLAMABAD (APP): The growing population and subsequent growth of residential settlement had put the capital's natural resources under severe stress with its wetlands, cleaner environment and water resource depleting gradually.

Once known for its serene evenings, open spaces, less congested population areas and healthy lifestyle, Islamabad in recent years, has gone through several transformations from road infrastructure to taller buildings and a large number of private housing societies developed in the suburbs.

Due to the ill planning of the city masters, the Islamabad Capital Territory

witnessed a massive population influx during the last two decades or so showing a 150 percent increase in its populace during the period 2008-2018.

This phenomenon not only polluted Capital's air and natural clean water streams but also exerted extreme pressure on groundwater with its table gone down from 80 to 100 feet two decades back to 250 to 300 feet presently.

As residents come across severe water shortages during summer, they are compelled to buy water from private operators through water tankers and these operators are now emerging as a cartel fleecing the citizens in the name of water provision in the absence of any declared tankers rates mechanism. "It is an apathy that

we regularly pay water bills to our societies but they fail to meet our water needs. Therefore, we have to buy it from tanker owners who charge us as per their desire," said Adil Mahmood, a resident of Doctor's Town. 'We fail to understand why the authorities do not gauge this situation while according to approval to the owners for developing a housing society," he said. "It is unjust that on one side they charge for routine water supply and on the other sell us water in tankers.

The tube wells installed to pump out ground-

# Hiccups in SCO diplomacy

The member states of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation were displeased with India's decision to host their 22<sup>nd</sup> summit virtually instead of in person. This decision was widely interpreted as a deliberate strategy to prevent inviting the Pakistani prime minister to Delhi and to convey a message to the US. Furthermore, it was perceived as an effort to transform the SCO into an organisation similar to the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation

The primary objective of establishing Saarc was to enhance economic and cultural cooperation in the South Asian region. It was agreed that the forum should not be utilised for discussing bilateral dis-

mistic expectation was shattered as Saarc members blamed India and Pakistan for the failure of this initiative. With the inclusion of India and Pakistan in the SCO, a sense of hope arose that both nations would eventually normalise relations, thereby fostering mutual interdependence. The SCO's potential for collaboration in security and counterterrorism was seen as an opportunity to influence the Pakistan-India relationship positively. Unfortunately, both countries have let down the Central Asian states, Russia and China thus far.

Instead of using the criticism as an opportunity to introspect, the diplomatic community resisted the feedback, seeing it as compromising a polished image.

The dichotomy is even more glaring when we consider the performance of Pakistani foreign missions in the economic and cultural sectors. A common perception is that these missions fall short of their

The conspicuous absence of Pakistani diplomats in such activities not only results in missed opportunities for enriching cross-cultural exchanges and academic dialogues but also adds to a perception of isolation.

Pakistani diplomats have shown a marked disinterest in connecting with local or visiting Pakistani scholars at embassies. In stark contrast, their proficiency in providing protocol to state officials and politicians is notable. This selective approach underscores a profound imbalance in their duties, favouring ceremonial procedures over substantial tasks. Pakistani diplomats have mastered the art of professional appearances. Afghan Taliban are struggling for global recognition. Regional and friendly states have refused to extend even de facto recognition to the Islamic rulers in Kabul. The Afghan Taliban, since taking over Kabul, have launched their efforts to change diplomats across the world, which were appointed by previous Ashraf Ghani government. However, few countries such as Pakistan, lowed new Afghan diplomats to take over their embassies and resume diplo-

#### Affordable houses for all: still a distant dream for people of KP

PESHAWAR Besides climate change, shabby economy and population bulge, Pakistan was also confronted to the monster challenge of providing affordable housing facility to all its citizens.

As the country's population has crossed the psychological barrier of 240 million mark in May this year, which means that about 10 million housing units including 2.5 million in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa would be required by 2040.

"Affordable housing was the fundamental right of all citizens of Pakistan where rapid population growth, migration from rural to urban areas, high

construction and land cost factors have largely contributed to houses backlog," said Professor Dr Z.A Malik, former Chairman, Economic Department, University of Pakistan while talking to APP.He said the current demand for new housing units is growing at the rate of 600,000 houses per year and if we add 0.5 million more houses, then 1.1 million units per year will be required to clear the existing backlog of 10 million houses in the next years.He said that the housing gap in Punjab was estimated at 2.3 million units in 2017 and was

expected to skyrocket to

11.3 million units by 2047.

He said that half of all urban households were overcrowded or lived in informal settlements with inadequate access to basic infrastructure, civic facilities and services while formal housing was almost

out of reach of the people.

Dr Malik said the rapid urbanization of the agricultural land turned the fertile land into unplanned towns and societies in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, especially in Peshawar, Mardan, Abbottabad, Swat, Kohat, DI Khan and

He said that the housing problems would further aggravate in Peshawar where the urban population had reached estimated that it would reach up to 2.80 million by 2030, that would eat up more agricultural land. As a result of the

#### US, South Korea, Japan hold missile defence drill after North's ICBM launch

**Monitoring Desk** SEOUL: The U.S., South Korea and Japan held a joint naval missile defence exercise on Sunday to counter North Korea's evolving nuclear and missile threats, the South's navy said, days after the North launched an intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM). North Korea fired its latest Hwasong-18 missile, which Pyongyang describes as the core of its nuclear strike force, off the east coast on Wednesday in what it said was a "strong practical warning" to the adversaries.

Sunday's trilateral drill was conducted in international waters between South Korea and Japan, bringing together destroyers equipped with Aegis radar systems from the three countries, the navy said. Washington and its Asian allies have been working to improve their information-sharing system on North Korea's missiles. South Korea and Japan are

independently linked to U.S. radar systems but not to each other's.

The exercise aimed at mastering the allies' response to a North Korean ballistic missile launch with a scenario featuring a virtual target, the military said. We will effectively

respond to North Korea's nuclear and missile threats with our military's strong response system and the trilateral cooperation," a South Korean Navy officer said. The North's ICBM launch was denounced by the U.S. South Korea and Japan, though Pyongyang has rejected the condemnation, saying it was an exercise of its right to self-defence. The latest launch followed heated complaints from North Korea in recent days, accusing American spy planes of flying over its exclusive economic zone waters, condemning a recent visit to South Korea by an U.S. nuclear-powered cruise missile submarine

Wallace to step down as

lawmaker at next election **Monitoring Desk** 

LONDON: British defence minister Ben Wallace will not stand as a member of parliament (MP) in the next UK national election, and will leave government when Prime Minister Rishi Sunak carries out his next cabinet reshuffle, he told The Sunday Times newspaper.

Wallace, a member of the ruling Conservative party, has been MP for Wyre and Preston North and its predecessor constituency in northwest England since 2005.

Advertisement • Scroll to continue He has been defence secretary for four years, helping lead Britain's response to Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

"I'm not standing next time," he said in an interview with the newspaper, but ruled out going "prematurely" and forcing another by-election.

Sunak is facing three by-elections next week, and opinion polls suggest his Conservative party could lose all of them.

A general election must be held in Britain within the next 18 months. The Sunday Times said a cabinet reshuffle was ex-

pected in September. The newspaper said Wallace told Sunak his plans on June 16 but had hoped to make the announcement over the summer before leaks forced his hand.

There had been speculation over Wallace's future in recent weeks. Boundary changes will see his parliamentary constituency scrapped at the next election and he had not publicly sought another seat.

He had been considered as a potential successor to NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg but Stoltenberg's contract was extended this month by another year.
