President, PM express grief over loss of lives Over 30 killed, scores injured as 10 bogies of Hazara Express derail near Nawabshah

Railways minister hints at possible sabotage, says accident could be result of a mechanical fault or the fault may have been 'created'

NAWABSHAH (INP): Over 30 people were killed and dozens others injured when ten bogies of Havelian bound Hazara Express derailed near the Sarĥari Railway Station close to Nawabshah on Sunday.

Local people, rescue personnel, railway officials, Pakistan Army, FC and officials of district management reached the scene and joined the rescue operation.

Talking to media at People's Medical College Hospital in Benazirabad, Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah confirmed the death toll.

He said that the injured could be shifted to Karachi if needed and directed the local administration and health officials to expedite relief and rescue

NAWABSHAH (APP): Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah arrived at Nawabshah on a short visit Soon after his arrival, the Chief Minister visited the emergency ward of Peoples Medical University Hospital and checked bed to bed of the victims of Hazara Express tragedy.

The Divisional Commissioner Nawabshah Muhammad Abbas Baloch briefed the Chief Minister over the tragic train incident.Later talking to the media, the Chief Minister gathered 30 casualties out of three are women and one is admitted at Sakrand while 29 dead bodies were brought to PMC. He said that total injured passengers were 110, which might increase as passengers were

still stranded in bogies.
CM said the ill-fated Hazara Express met with an accident near Sarhari which is a very tragic incident. He said that the cause of the accident could be ascertained after complete investigation of the mishap.

He directed hospital said that as per information administration to provide

better treatment facilities to injured people and also. appealed to people of Nawabshah, particularly media persons to vacate the hospital and give time to doctors for treatment of victims. He said that doctors have also advised him to avoid visiting the ICU however he has appealed to the media to vacate the hospi tal and also tell people to give space to doctors and medical staff.

CM urged rushing people to give space to relatives of injured and dead passengers to visit them.

strengthening social safety Global rice price index reaches record high in 12 years

LAHORE (APP): The world rice price index of the United Nations Food Agency (UNFA) experienced a notable 2.8 percent rise in July, as compared to June, reaching the highest level recorded in almost 12 years.

The overall world food price index also notably rebounded in UNFA report issued

here.
This hike in prices was mainly driven by excessive demand in key exporting countries and India's decision to restrict exports, it said.

Ukraine and its allies have said the talks are an attempt to secure broad international support for principles that Kyiv wants to be the basis for peace, including the withdrawal of all Russian troops and the return of all Ukrainian territory to its control. President Volodymir Zelenskiy has said he wants a global summit to take place based on those principles later this year. Eighteen months after Russia invaded Ukraine, any prospect of direct peace talks between Kyiv and Moscow appears remote.

2 dead, 57 rescued from migrant shipwrecks off Italy's Lampedusa

Monitoring Desk ROME: Italy's coastguard said on Sunday it had recovered two bodies and rescued 57 people off the southern island of Lampedusa, amid reports that more than 30 people were missing following two shipwrecks.

The Ansa news agency, citing survivors' accounts, reported that two migrant boats that had set off from the port of Sfax, a hotspot for Tunisia's migration crisis, had sunk on Saturday on their way to Europe. One was carrying 48 people, the second 42, Ansa said, add-

ing that the coastguard found the survivors about 23 nautical miles (46 km) south-west of Lampedusa, as well as the two victims a woman from Ivory Coast and her one-year-old child. A coastguard spokesperson said he could only confirm the number of survivors and the recovery of two

More than 2,000 people have arrived in Lampedusa in the last few days after being rescued at sea by Italian patrol boats and NGO groups, as strong winds further complicate the situation around the island.

Irrigation water shortage persists despite flood in Indus river; claims SAB

The Sindh Abadgar Board (SAB) has complained that despite of low to medium flood in the Indus river, which undeniably showed over-abundance of water, the farmers in many parts of the province cannot cultivate their crops because of water scarcity. The meeting of the SAB which was chaired by its Vice President Mahmood Nawaz Shah here Sunday, deplored that even though flood situation persisted in the river, many areas were still dealing with 7 to 15 days water rotation which was usually carried out during periods of water shortage. The growers said besides the downstream of Kotri barrage, shortage also existed in Rohri, Nara, Dadu
