ISLAMABAD (Online): Supreme Court (SC) has nullified the trial of civilians in military courts.

Announcing the reserved judgment on Monday, the SC accepted the petition filed against the trial in military courts.

The SC said in short order the trial of those accused in May 9 incidents will be carried out in civilian courts

The court declared both the sub sections of section 2-1(D) of official secret act are contrary to constitution.

The court also declared clause 4 (59) of official secret act (4) 59.

The SC said in its order the cases against the accused be run in criminal courts keeping in view the nature of the offences of the accused.

Afghanistan shock Pakistan by eight wickets in World Cup

Sports Desk CHENNAI: Afghanistan defeated Pakistan by eight wickets to win their second match of the World Cup 2023 at MA Chidambaram Stadium, Chennai.

Afghanistan chased down the target of 283 runs in 49th over with eight wickets in hand. Afghanistan wrote the history as they defeated Pakistan for the first time in ODI. Afghanistan rode on the back of impressive innings from İbrahim Zadran (87), Rahmat Shah (77 not out), Rahmanullah Gurbaz (65) and skipper Hashmatullah Shahidi (48 not out).

Earlier, Afghanistan also stunned defending champions England in the tournament. With this defeat, Pakistan now have two wins and three losses from their five group games.

Earlier, Pakistan set 283 runs target for Afghanistan to win the important match of the World Cup.

Pakistan won the toss and elected to bat first. Captain Babar Azam remained


SBP increases retention limit of IT exporters to 50%

KARACHI (APP): State approval from SBP or Bank of Pakistan (SBP) on Monday introduced new measures to facilitate Information Technology Exporters and Freelancers for bolstering exports of IT and IT-enabled services.

"This is not what we want, not what we're looking for. We don't want escalation," Blinken said. "We don't want to see our forces or our personnel come under fire. But if that happens,

MANILA: A Chinese coast to guard ship and an accompanying vessel rammed a Philippine coast guard ship and a military-run supply boat Sunday off a contested shoal, Philippine officials said, in an encounter that heightened fears of an armed conflict in the disputed South China Sea.

A top Philippine security official told The Associated Press there were no injuries among the Filipino crew members and an assessment of the damage to both vessels was underway.

The official said that the two incidents near Second Thomas Shoal, where China has repeatedly tried to isolate a Philippine marine outpost, could have been worse if the vessels were not able to maneuver rapidly away from the Chinese ships. The official spoke on condition of anonymity due to a lack of authority to publicly discuss the matter.

China's sweeping territorial claims in the South China Sea, including over islands closer to Philippine shore, have raised tensions and brought in the United States, a longtime treaty ally of the Philippines.




