Governor Balochistan says: Pakistan to continue supporting suppressed Kashmiris, Palestinians

WAZIRABAD (APP): Governor Balochistan, Malik Abdul Wali Khan Kakar, reaffirmed the government's resolve to support the suppressed people of Kashmir and Palestine, urging immediate intervention by the international community and an end to gross human rights violations.

He was addressing the participants of a protest rally on Friday, which was organized to mark October 27 as the Black Day when the tyrant forces of India illegally occupied the then princely state of Kashmir in 1947.

Top US diplomat discusses Mideast conflict with Jilani

WASHINGTON (APP): A senior American diplomat Thursday spoke with Pakistani caretaker foreign Minister Jilal Abbas Jilani to discuss "critical issues" in the US-Pakistan partnership, including the Israel-Palestine conflict, according to State Department spokesperson Mathew Miller.

The Acting Deputy Secretary of State and Under Secretary for Political Affairs, Victoria Nuland, also discussed "our mutual interest in facilitating the safe and timely resettlement of eligible Afghans to the United States," Miller said in a statement.

"They also agreed on

the importance of free and fair elections that are inclusive and held in a manner consistent with Pakistan's laws," the statement said.

During a discussion on the raging Israel-Palestinian conflict, the Acting Deputy Secretary highlighted the United States' call for the release of all hostages and the protection of civilians from harm, it said.

"Acting Deputy Secretary Nuland and Foreign Minister Jilani also agreed on the need for a continuous flow of humanitarian aid to civilians in Gaza and to prevent the conflict from spreading," the statement added.

Mahatir says:

India, Israel resorting to identical tactics to change demographic composition of Kashmir & Palestine

ISLAMABAD (APP): Former Malaysian Prime Minister Dr Mahathir Muhammad on Friday, drawing parallels between Kashmir and Palestine issues, said India was resorting to the same tactics that had been employed by Israel to suppress the voice of people of occupied areas over the decades.

He said India was now attempting to radically change the demographic composition of the occupied Jammu & Kashmir by settling non-Muslim outsiders in the Muslim majority areas in the same way the Israeli settlers have forcefully evicted Palestinians from their homes in the land grab activities sanctioned by the Tel Aviv regime."

Dr Mahatir, in his video message played at an event organized by the Pakistan High Commission in Malaysia to mark the Kashmir Black Day 2023.

He said India's revocation of Jammu & Kashmir's autonomy unilaterally four years ago saw the deployment of hundreds of thousands of soldiers into the illegally occupied territories of Jammu and Kashmir.

"Along with that, atrocities were committed, while placing the whole population under siege."

Chief Minister Naqvi appreciated the Commissioner Rawalpindi and Frontier Works Organization over their performance.

The work on the project should be completed swiftly, he said and directed the authorities to provide necessary project drawings

to NESPAK as soon as possible. The Sindh CM appreciated the ongoing projects in Punjab, especially the construction work of Rawalpindi Ring Road. He said the problems being faced by the commuters in Karachi could be resolved through the Lyari Expressway and Karachi Circular Railway projects.

Mohsin Naqvi offered full support of the Punjab government to his Sindh counterpart in the execution of different projects in the province.

CM Naqvi drove the vehicle himself and

inspected the project site with the Sindh chief minister.

They also reviewed the progress of the project at Union Council Trahia.

In order to speed up the work on the Ring Road, CM Naqvi directed the authorities to use additional road leveling machinery at the project site. He said the Rawalpindi Ring Road was an important project of public interest and all-out efforts should be made to complete it before the stipulated time frame.

The FWO officials, during a briefing, informed the CM that six-lane Rawalpindi Ring Road would be 38.3 kilometers long.

13 dead, 1,320 injured in Punjab road accidents

LAHORE: At least 13 people were killed and 1,320 others injured in 1,228 road accidents in Punjab during the last 24 hours. As many as 669 people with serious injuries were shifted to different hospitals, while 651 with minor injuries were treated at the incident site by the rescue medical teams.

The data analysis showed that 629 drivers, 41 underage drivers, 162 pedestrians, and 542 passengers were among the victims of road crashes.

The statistics show that 277 accidents were reported in Lahore, which affected 301 people, placing the provincial capital at top of the list, followed by 95 in Faisalabad with 103 victims and at third Multan with 81 accidents and 75 victims.

According to the data, 1,043 motorbikes, 85 auto-rickshaws, 138 motorcars, 33 vans, 13 passenger buses, 21 trucks and 111 other types of vehicles and slow-moving carts were involved in these road accidents.

After finding south no safer, Gazans head back north

KHAN YUNIS: When Israel warned civilians to leave northern Gaza, Rahma Saqallah and her family fled south. But after Israeli bombs killed her husband and three of her children, she decided to head back home.

"Wherever we go, we will die," Saqallah said, as she prepared to leave the city of Khan Yunis, in the south of the territory to return to Gaza City with her surviving child.

She is among roughly 600,000 Palestinians who went south in response to Israel's warning to evacuate "for your own safety".

But repeated deadly strikes on the south of the territory in recent days have prompted 30,000 of the displaced to head back home, according to UN figures.

Many were in any case struggling to find shelter in Khan Yunis, an al-

ready densely populated city which has been swamped by the influx of families fleeing the north.

Israel expects 'long' ground war in Gaza to destroy Hamas and its many tunnels

DEIR AL-BALAH: Israel expects to launch a long and difficult ground offensive into Gaza soon to destroy Hamas, the country's defense minister said Friday, describing a campaign that will require dismantling a vast network of tunnels used by the territory's militant rulers.

Defense Minister Yoav Gallant spoke to a small group of foreign reporters in Tel Aviv after Israeli forces backed by fighter jets and drones carried out a second, limited ground raid into Gaza in as many days, striking the outskirts of Gaza City.

Gallant said the ground invasion that follows weeks of airstrikes "will take a long time," and that it would lead to another lengthy phase of lower-intensity fighting, as Israel destroys "pockets of resistance."

In a sign of rising tensions in the region, U.S. warplanes struck targets in eastern Syria that the Pentagon said were linked to Iran's Revolutionary Guard after a string of attacks on American forces, and two mysterious objects hit towns in Egypt's Sinai Peninsula.

Palestinians plead 'stop the bombs' at UN meeting but Israel insists Hamas must be 'obliterated'

UNITED NATIONS: "Stop the bombs and save lives!" the Palestinian ambassador pleaded at an emotional U.N. meeting Thursday on the war in Gaza. But Israel's envoy was adamant, declaring again, "We will not rest until Hamas is obliterated."

The war sparked by Gaza's Hamas rulers' surprise attacks on Israel on Oct. 7 played out in the vast hall of the 193-nation General Assembly, where Arab nations expected to adopt a resolution Friday calling for an immediate cease-fire in Gaza after the Security Council's four failed attempts to agree on any armistice.

At the assembly's resumed emergency special session on Israeli actions in the Palestinian territories Thursday, speaker after

speaker backed the Arab resolution's cease-fire call — except for Israel's U.N. Ambassador Gilad Erdan, who told the 193-member world body, "A cease-fire means giving Hamas time to regroup itself, so they can massacre us again."

After quoting several Hamas statements vowing to destroy Israel and the Jews, he said, "Any call for a cease-fire is not an attempt at peace. It is an attempt to tie Israel's hands, preventing us from eliminating a huge threat to our citizens."

On another key issue — the more than 220 hostages taken from Israel — Iran's foreign minister said Hamas is ready to release civilian prisoners, and he said the international community must take responsibility for releasing 6,000 Palestinian prisoners held in Israel.

27 killed after hurricane lashes Mexico

ACAPULCO: Hurricane killed at least 27 people as it lashed Mexico's beach resort city of Acapulco as a scale-topping category 5 storm, officials said on Thursday, in what residents called a "total disaster." The storm crashed into Acapulco with furious winds of 165 miles (270 kilometers) per hour, largely cutting off communications and road links with the region.

President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador arrived at the scene late on Wednesday, after his convoy found roads blocked by landslides and other debris, forcing top officials to abandon their vehicles and walk the final miles. The closures meant some residents slogged for hours through mud and debris in an attempt to find food and shelter.

EU leaders urge pauses in Gaza bombing to get aid in

BRUSSELS: EU leaders called on Thursday for pauses in Israeli bombing and Hamas rocket attacks to get humanitarian aid into Gaza after days of wrangling that highlighted divisions within the bloc over the broader Israel-Palestinian conflict. In a declaration agreed at a summit in Brussels, the leaders of the Union's 27 nations expressed the "gravest concern for the deteriorating humanitarian situation in Gaza."

They called for "continued, rapid, safe and unhindered humanitarian access and aid to reach those in need through all necessary measures including humanitarian corridors and pauses for humanitarian needs".

The summit was the leaders' first in-person meeting since the deadly Oct. 7 assault on Israel by Palestinian militant group Hamas, which prompted Israel to bombard and blockade Hamas-run Gaza.

China nudges Mongolia to join Eurasian security bloc

BEIJING: Chinese Premier Li Qiang said China will boost its cooperation with Mongolia under a Eurasian security bloc, which this year admitted its ninth member, Iran, gently nudging its smaller neighbour to join a regional group that also includes Russia. Mongolia has refrained from joining the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) for almost two decades, choosing to be an observer state since 2004 even as other nations.

Blinken, Wang meet as US-China gear up towards expected leaders summit

WASHINGTON: U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken and China's top diplomat Wang Yi reconvened for a second day of meetings on Friday as the two rival powers discuss how to manage differences while laying groundwork for an expected summit between President Joe Biden and his counterpart Xi Jinping. Wang arrived at the State Department late on Thursday and held a meeting with Blinken followed by a dinner. The two diplomats engaged again on Friday morning, sitting across from each other at a wide table with their senior aides before journalists were ushered out of the closed-door meeting.

Wang is set to head to the White House and meet with U.S. National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan later on Friday. He is also expected to speak with Biden, although it is unclear how substantial their interaction will be.

Wang's three-day visit is the latest in a flurry of diplomatic engagements between China and the U.S., and the trip primarily is to prepare for an expected Biden summit in November on the sidelines of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation leaders meeting in San Francisco.

US military says Chinese fighter jet came within 10 feet of B-52 bomber over South China Sea

BANGKOK: A Chinese fighter jet came within 10 feet of an American B-52 bomber flying over the South China Sea, nearly causing an accident, the U.S. military said, underscoring the potential for a mishap as both countries vie for influence in the region.

In the night intercept, the Shenyang J-11 twin-engine fighter closed on the U.S. Air Force plane at an "uncontrolled excessive speed" flying below, in front of, and within 10 feet of the B-52, putting both aircraft in danger of a collision, the U.S. Indo-Pacific Command said in a statement released late Thursday. "We are concerned this pilot was unaware of how

close he came to causing a collision," the military said. China's Foreign Ministry put the blame on the U.S., suggesting the American aircraft was flying over the South China Sea as a deliberate provocation. "The U.S. military planes traveled thousands of miles to China's doorstep to flex muscle," said Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Mao Ning. "That is the source of maritime and air security risks, and is not conducive to regional peace and stability." The U.S. military said in its statement that the aircraft was "lawfully conducting routine operations" ahead of the intercept Tuesday.
