# SC suspends verdict of nullifying civilians' trial in army courts

Verdict allows military trial of civilians held in connection with May 9 riots; Justice Hilali differs with majority decision

In an interview with the official flagship Journal of ICMA International, the minister said for the second quarter (Q2), the government expects to receive over \$1.6 billion from these sources.



# **Maintainability of** ZAB reference

At the outset of hearing of presidential reference seeking revisiting the PPP founder and former prime minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto (ZAB) murder case, a senior judge of the Supreme Court, Mr. Justice Mansoor Ali Shah has questioned the PPP counsel over the maintainability of the reference. SC's senior judge Justice Syed Masoor observed that matter pertaining to trial of ZAB had attained finality as a review petition had been dismissed earlier, so how can the apex court re-open the case that has already been concluded. It may be mentioned here that a nine-member bench of the apex court headed by CJP Justice Qazi Faez Isa heard the presidential reference seeking revisiting the ZAB murder case.

The apex court heard the attorney general and PPP counsel Farooq H Naek, and adjourned the hearing till second week of January, 2024. The court also appointed amicus curiae (friends of court) having expertise on criminal and constitutional fields for its assistance in the presidential reference. The proceedings were broadcasted live at the Supreme Court website. The CJP, while dictating the order of the court proceedings, noted that the application of Naek had become infructuous as the SC committee has already decided in that regard.

Justice Syed Mansoor observed that matter pertaining to trial of ZAB had already attained finality as a review petition had also been dismissed; therefore, the apex court had no jurisdiction to hear a second review petition. The judge asked Naek as to what decision the court could give, and asked him to assist the court on the question of maintainability. Meanwhile, the court after the hearing the matter, dictating its order and noted that Attorney General Mansoor Usman read out the presidential reference as well as the order of the court given on April 21, 2011, containing the questions to be addressed. The court noted down in its order that the reference was

filed in 2011 and the last hearing was held in 2012. It noted that in the same order a number of amicus curies who were appointed among them some have passed away while some are alive. Ali Ahmed Kurd advocate. who was also among those amicus curies has consented to assist the court, while Makhdom Ali Khan is also willing to do so as well, the order noted, adding that the court consider to appoint constitutional experts, particularly on the scope of Article 186 whereby the presidential reference was filed, and the question of maintainability of the reference. The order noted that it needed wisdom of criminal experts, so name of Justice (retd) Manzooi Ahmed Malik was proposed, and the parties supported it. Accordingly, subject to his assent, he is appointed as amicus curiae and he may submit a concise statement in this regard, the court noted and also appointed Khwaja Haris as amicus curiae. Haris was the Punjab advocate general when the case was earlier heard by the Supreme Court. The court also appointed Salman Safdar as amicus curiae on criminal side as well as Faisal Siddiqui advocate on constitutional side to assist it. Farooq Naek raised objections on the two lawyers.

The court, however, turned down the objections and held that it was its prerogative to appoint amicus curiae. The court also appointed Raza Rabani as amicus curiae on constitutional side besides appointing also former AG Khalid Javed Khan, Salahuddin Ahmed, Barrister Zahid Ihrahim and Yasir Ourashi as amicus curiae on constitutional side. Barrister Aitzaz Ahsan, however, refused to assist the court as amicus curiae

# A people's poet

We live in a world where they say we communicate more, but the world stayed silent when slave trade was making money/ The world stayed silent when the Nazis started to kill trade unionists, people with disabilities, homoleft-handed sexuals. people and Jews/ And now in the age of the global village and mass communi-

cations the world is stay-

ing silent when Palestin-

ians are being annihilated. The outstanding British poet, novelist, broadcaster, actor and agitator Benjamin Zephaniah wrote those words several years ago but, like much of his verse, they remain potently relevant. And alive. Unlike, depressingly, the poet himself, who died last week at the age of 65 just two weeks after being diagnosed with a brain tumour. To paraphrase his favourite Dylan Thomas poem, he went gently into the good night after a life-

"When I was young," he once noted, there were two things I really wanted to see: a free South Africa and a free Palestine." That wish remained only half-fulfilled. In the former instance, his contribution was recognised by none other than Nelson Mandela. In 1982, the first single The Wailers recorded after Bob Marley's death was 'Free South Africa', with Zephaniah on vocals.

Palestine. Over the decades, his passion for the cause never wavered. Hardly any obituary has acknowledged that he was a patron of Britain's Palestinian Solidarity Campaign. Born in Birmingham to parents from Barbados and Jamaica, he had a difficult birth and health issues pursued him into adult-

hood. Severe dyslexia led him to drop out of school in his early teens, and enter a life of petty crime that in one instance involved almost being beaten to death at a police station. By his late teens, Zephaniah realised that an early death beckoned unless he escaped his milieu, so he went to London and joined a different kind of gang — of poets and artists. He thrived, despite his abbreviated schooling and lack of further education. That was not unrelated to the fact that he had resolved at the age of eight to go vegan, and to earn his living as a poet. His reading woes as a dyslexic did not interfere with his determination to express

He did so in ways that appealed to those who disdained poetry mainly attributed to dead white males. "Most people ignore most poetry because most people ignores most people," as the late poet Adrian Mitchell put it. Zephaniah did not follow that trajectory. He spoke directly to his burgeoning audiences, with little patience for abstractions, allusions or complicated imagery. What-

Formally, the judicial system remains intact: the robed honourable judges still show up in court. Lawyers still get to make a few noises, smug in their delusion that their word may carry the day. Nonetheless, there

has been an overwhelming attrition of faith in the courts. The bulk of the blame has been put on the judiciary, that the judges, with the prefix 'honourable', were sup-posed to be the custodians of the people's rights. That they were to intervene, ensure protection, and stand between the wrath of the state and the people.

Such a huge ask from the judiciary was never realistic, and not even fair. ## SC decides to hear all lifetime disqualification cases together

ISLAMABAD (APP): The Supreme Court (SC) has decided to hear all identical cases pertaining to lifetime disqualification under Article 62(1)(f) of the Constitution together.

These cases, and any

others involving the same question, should be fixed for hearing in early January, 2024 before a bench constituted by the committee under the Act, the court said in its written order pertaining to the hearing of an appeal of JUI-F's former MPA Meer Badshah Qaisrani against his lifetime disqualification. The apex court said that the general elections of 2008 required candidates to have a minimum graduation qualification. Some candidates made misdeclarations in their requisite nomination papers, some produced degrees from unrecognized institutions and others fake degrees to show eligibility of their participation in the general elections. This court had disqualified all such candidates and some also faced criminal prosecution. It said that the petitioner was convicted for a period of two years, and we are informed that his appeal against conviction is pending before the Multan Bench of the Lahore High Court. "However, the learned counsel for the respondent states that the period of disqualification is for five years as per section 232(2) of the Elections Act, 2017, which provision was enacted through the Elections (Amendment) Act, 2023, promulgated on 26 June 2023.
