

# One of my ADCs stole cipher at behest of Gen (Retd) Bajwa

RÀWALPINDI (Önline): PTI founder Imran Khan has said one of his Aides de Camp (ADC) stole the cipher at behest of former army chief Gen (Retd) Qamar Javed Bajwa.

He said this in his statement recorded under 342 during the hearing of cipher case in Adiala jail Tuesday.

While recording his statement Imran Khan said cipher was in Prime Minister (PM) House. The responsibility of security rests with military secretary, principal secretary and secretary protocol who sees the secu-

rity of PM house. He further said during my tenure of three and half years this is the only document which went missing from PM house. After cipher went missing I asked mili tary secretary to hold in quiry. That was the only occasion when I got offended with military secre-

He stated one of his ADCs stole cipher at the behest of Gen (Retd) Bajwa.

Military secretary told after inquiry that no evidence has been found with reference to cipher. He said elected PM was

removed through conspiracy. Gen (Retd) Bajwa and US Secretary of state Donald Lu were involved in the conspiracy. Conspiracy was hatched in 2021 to pull down my government when Gen (Retd) Bajwa changed the then ISI Chief Gen (Retd) Faiz.

# **Mending fences**

From exchanging missile strikes two weeks ago to trading compliments, Pakistan and Iran have managed to handle a potentially explosive crisis in a mature fashion.

On Jan 16, Iran had bizarrely launched strikes on Panjgur hitting, what it said, were terrorists affiliated with the Jaish al-Adl outfit. Pakistan said two children died in the incident. Two days later, Pakistan replied to the violation of its sovereignty by striking targets in the Iranian town of Saravan neutralising, as per the state, several Baloch sepa-

But the acrimony seemed a thing of the past as caretaker Foreign Minister Jalil Abbas Jilani met his Iranian counterpart Hossein Amir-Abdollahian in Islamabad on Monday, indicating that the crisis was now behind both states. It is also hoped that as relations improve, the brutal murder of nine Pakistani workers in Saravan on Saturday is fully probed.

Mr Amir-Abdollahian said both countries were "one nation" while observing that "third countries" were aiding militants in the common border area. Meanwhile, Mr Jilani said that a "high-level mechanism" was being established to oversee bilateral cooperation, while adding that liaison officers would be stationed in Turbat and Zahedan.

Indeed, this display of cooperation is a welcome change from the acrimonious exchanges that had threatened to scuttle bilateral ties. Both sides chose to handle the crisis with wisdom, as opposed to jingoistic nationalism. This should serve as a template to manage all future bilateral ties.

While the exchange of pleasantries makes for good optics, both Islamabad and Tehran need to get down to business and address the single biggest irritant that stands in the way of better ties: border security. Both sides have pledged to work for collective security, and these promises should be followed by action to secure their common bor-

Whether it is religiously motivated militants working against Iran that allegedly find refuge in Pakistan, or Baloch separatists plotting against Pakistan on Iranian soil, both sides need to address the threats these non-state actors pose through mutual cooperation; under no circumstances should unilateral action be taken, as Iran did a few weeks ago. The crisis was defused this time, but there is no guarantee that similar rational behaviour will prevail in the future. With regard to the killing of Pakistani workers, those involved in this heinous crime need to be identified and brought to justice, while Tehran should ensure security for all Pakistanis living in or visiting Iran. A few weeks from now a new administration will take over in Islamabad, and it will be up to the new rulers to build on the points agreed to during the foreign ministers' meeting. Both sides should also be wary of inimical foreign actors working to destabilise the border areas in the hopes of souring the Pakistan-Iran relationship.


# **Canal Road** to be closed to traffic on Feb 4-6: WASA

# **New Hong Kong** national security law to add five crimes

**Monitoring Desk** HONG KONĞ: Hong

Kong will create its own national security law "as soon as possible", city leader John Lee said on Tuesday, adding insurrection and other crimes not covered by existing legislation imposed by Beijing four years ago.

Massive pro-democracy protests rocked the finance hub in 2019, bringing hundreds of thousands of people to the streets to call for greater freedoms. In response, Beijing

imposed a national security law to punish four major crimes - secession, subversion, terrorism, and collusion with foreign forces with sentences ranging up to life in prison.

Officials on Tuesday said Hong Kong's security law — mandated by Article 23 of the city's mini-constitution — will cover five offences: treason, insurrection, espionage, destructive activities endangering national security, and external

'While we society as a whole looks calm and very safe, we still have to watch out for potential sabotage and undercurrents that try to create troubles, particularly some of the independent Hong Kong ideas that are still embedded in some people's minds," Lee told a press conference.

'The threats to national security are real, we have experienced them and suffered from them badly ..] we don't want to go through that painful experience again," he said, adding that "some foreign agents may still be active in Hong Kong"
