

Federal Ombudsman disposes of 193,030 complaints

ISLAMABAD (APP): The Federal Ombudsman office (Wafaqi Mohtasib Secretariat) has disposed of 193,030 complaints, which is 22 percent higher than the previous year.

Briefing the delegation of Associated Press of Pakistan's (APP) Youth Media Training Program (YMTP), Senior Advisor, Wafaqi Mohtasib Secretariat, Moiz Bokhari said that during the outgoing year 2023, this office received and processed a record number of complaints which stood at 194,106 that is 18% higher than the preceding years.

He said that a system of strict monitoring, follow up and verification of the implementation of each and every decision was in place and an impressive imple-mentation rate of 85.4% was recorded in 2023. adding that 88% complaints were disposed of within the prescribed limit of 60 days.

Caretaker debate

As the dust settles on the postelection process, there is increasing public discussion about the concept of caretaker governments, and their utility in Pakistan's political milieu.

Much of this talk has been sparked by the problematic performance of the interim setup that oversaw last month's general elections. In a recent Senate debate, there were calls to do away with the system of caretakers, with lawmakers saying that it had no place in a parliamentary democracy.

Furthermore, according to some media reports, the PML-N and PPP have decided to jetchallenges and troubles. tison the caretaker system. It should be remembered that in the 2006 Charter of Democracy, Benazir Bhutto and Nawaz Sharif had endorsed the idea of a "neutral caretaker government" to hold free and fair polls. Apparently, events in Pakistan's political history in the years since the Charter was signed have made both parties reconsider their positions.

There was no concept of a caretaker set-up conducting polls in the 1973 Constitution. The idea emerged after the debacle following the 1977 polls, which were widely seen as manipulated. Yet most caretaker governments in the country with the exception of a few – have failed in their basic task of conducting fair polls accepted by all stakeholders.







It was one of the largest displays of defiance against President Vladimir Putin since he invaded Ukraine, and happened just weeks before an election he is all but assured to win. Putin has no doubt he will secure another term in Russia's election. The vote that leaves him in suspense, and could do more to change his policies, will occur eight months later in the United States.


PPP plans to set up presidential guest house in Lahore
