QUETTA: The Government of Balochistan has enforced rain situation as it is our responsibility to steer the people rain and urban flood emergency in the rain affected areas of the province.

Following the rain and urban flood emergency, leaves of all concerned officers and staff including those serving in the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) have been cancelled, stated the spokesman, Government of Balochistan here.

According to the spokesman, the Chief Minister Mir Sarfraz Ahmed Bugti chaired online meeting with all divisional commissioners and high ups of PDMA on late Sunday night.

The Principal Secretary to Chief Minister and Director General PDMA briefed the meeting about overall situation of rains besides relief and rescue activities in the province

The Chief Minister expressed anguish over the public complaints about the sewerage and sanitation issues in the metropolis.

He said that the government would provide whole-

hearted support and resources to the field officers in the out of the hardships and miserable situation.

He issued clear directives to the field officers to remove encroachments established on the sewerage nullahs. APP adds: Balochistan government has declared rain

and urban flood emergency due to continuous heavy rains which battered different districts of the province, killing and injuring several people across the province, spokesman of the Balochistan government Shahid Rind said on Monday.

He said the leave of all officers and staff has been canceled to promptly ensure rescue services to people in the flood-hit areas and to avert any untoward situation.

Shahid Rind said schools will remain closed on April 5 and 16 in rain-affected districts of the province. 

Maleeha Lodhi The global debate over governance continues — what constitutes good governance and how it helps to determine the fate and forunes of nations.

It is axiomatic that effective governance and competent leadership are what make the difference between successful and unsuccessful states. Economic development, in fact, depends on good governance. And this, in turn, has much to do with the quality of governance institutions,

their responsiveness to public needs and people's faith in them.

In an increasingly complex world, governance challenges have become more daunting. New technologies have created unprecedented flows of instant information to heighten the challenge. Technology has empowered citizens and increased governments should deliver. But governments are seen to lack agility in a fast-moving world

But rather than 1984 or the Minority Report, I look at Pakistan as a prime example of hate speech laws gone wrong, where the mere sugges tion of sacrilege results in pogroms, desecration, gal process against it has even begun.

Meanwhile, vulnerable populations women, khwaja siras and intersex people, the disabled, non-Muslims and minority sects - continue to experience hatred, discrimination and violence freely expressed in thought, words, and action. In Pakistan, this kind of hatred is not banned; instead, it is weaponised. When will we come up with the kind of laws to protect our citizens from that?

The hate crime law, passed in 2021, came into effect on April 1, 2024. It does not include protections for biological women. Instead, the Scottish government, led by First Minister Humza Yousuf, proposes to enact a separate law criminalising misogyny at a later date. 




