

CM approves policy to upgrade all primary schools to bring 4.1 m out-of-school children to schools

KARACHI (APP): The Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah presiding Education Minister Sardar over an important meeting regarding bringing back 4.1 million out-of-school children to schools directed the School Education Department to implement a policy of gradually upgrading all primary schools to post-primary schools and develop a connection with cluster schools to retain children and prevent the drop-

out ratio from increasing.

The meeting was held at the CM House and was attended by Minister of Education Syed Sardar Shah, PSCM Agha Wasif, Secretary of School Education Zahid Abbasi, and other

concerned officers.
The Chief Minister mentioned that the Pakistan Institute of Education (PIE) published a report in January 2024, which stated that there are 26.2 million children out of school in Pakistan. Sindh's share in this number came out to be 7.63 million children, which UNICEF Sindh conducted a

Shah quoted the latest fig-ures from the Ministry of Education (Federal Government), he said there are 4.1 million children out of school in Sindh.

The education minister further informed the Chief Minister that there are a total of 14,208,257 children in Sindh, out of which 10,204,647 are receiving education in government, private, Madrasah, Sindh Education Foundation, and other institutions, while 4.1 million are out-of-school.Breaking down the numbers, he stated that 4.5 million children attended government schools, 3.9 million attended private schools, and 840,000 children attended Sindh Education Foundation. Additionally, 500,000 children attended Madarsahs, and 500,000 attended federal/

The results of the study revealed that children between the ages of 5 and 16 were out of school for several reasons. These included 20 per cent of households living in poverty, 16 per cent of families not giving importance to education, 15 per cent of girls' schools not being available, 14 per cent of schools being too far away 13 per cent of children engaging in livelihoods, 13 per cent of nearby educational institutes lacking appropriate infrastructure, and eight per cent of cultural barriers towards girls' education.

During a meeting, Education Minister Sardar Shah informed the Chief Minister that there were 36,234 primary schools and 4,730 post-primary schools, which resulted in a 54 per cent drop-out rate for children at the postprimary level.

Govt to block mobile phone SIMs of over 500,000 non-filers

Tax watchdog makes public the names of 506,671 non-filers; Cellphone SIMs of these individuals can be blocked at any time.

In a robust action against non-filers amid the prevailing financial crisis being faced by the cash-strapped country, the government on Tuesday directed the Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA) and the telecom companies to block mobile phone SIMs of over 500,000 non-filers.

In a statement, the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) said: "In exercise of the powers conferred under section 114B of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001, the FBR is pleased to issue this Income Tax General Order (ITGO) to disable the mobile phone SIMs in respect of following persons who

ISLAMABAD (Agencies): are not appearing on active taxpayer list but are liable to file the Income Tax Return for Tax Year 2023 under the provisions of the Income Tax Ordinance,

It is still early days, but there have been several small developments over the past week that, it is hoped, may add up to something bigger in the coming future.

The ice between the government and opposition benches, which began to show signs of a thaw last week, seems to have melted some more over the weekend, and the two factions are apparently in agreement that negotiations can help break the current deadlock. However, it is also becoming clear that there will be some major stumbling blocks.

For one, the PTI clearly does not know what it wants. Over the weekend, its leaders issued conflicting statements regarding whom they want to parley with and what their preconditions are for the talks. It would appear that the party is still seeking a settlement with the establishment, while some of the conditions it has set for the dialogue seem like a very long shot.

There will be progress only when the two factions can differentiate between dialogue and surrender. For example, the PTI may feel it has a moral right to demand its 'stolen' seats back from the government, but it cannot expect the latter to simply hand over its leverage in such a manner. The party ought to realise that any talks will only take place within the existing power configuration, even if its legitimacy is up for debate. Its other demand — the release of imprisoned leaders, including Imran Khan — is reasonable and, in fact, the government should consider facilitating this at the earliest.

The inaccessibility of key central leaders is contributing to the confusion within the PTI's ranks, which will continue to make any talks with it next to impossible. Any negotiation needs to be publicly sanctioned by the PTI founder, even if he does not participate in it himself. Otherwise. it would mean nothing in the eyes of the party's

Lastly and most importantly, it would be most disappointing if the PTI repeats the mistake of turning to the establishment instead of negotiating directly with its rivals — something which it is shockingly still not averse to. It is an unfortunate reality of Pakistan's power politics that every party wants to engage directly with the security establishment.

However, there is an opportunity right now for democratic forces to retake the legislative domain as long as they agree to respect each other. Regardless of how many seats it believes it won, the PTI does not represent every citizen of Paki-

The other parties are equally legitimate stakeholders in the country's political future, and it must give them due consideration. The PTI need only look at how the PDM fared in the Feb 8 elections to realise how sour non-political 'solutions' to political problems can become.



Most of Asia swelters in extreme heatwave

MANILA: South and Southeast Asia braced for more extreme heat on Sunday, as authorities across the region issued health warnings and residents fled to parks and air-conditioned malls for relief. A wave of exceptionally hot weather has blasted the region over the past week, sending the mercury as high as 45 degrees Celsius and forcing thousands of schools to tell students to stay home.

The Philippines announced on Sunday the suspension of in-person classes at all public schools for two days after a record-shattering day of heat in the capital Manila. In Thailand, where at least 30 people have died of heatstroke so far this year, the meteorological department warned of "severe conditions" after temperatures in a northern province exceeded 44.1C (111.4F) on Saturday.

And in Cambodia, Myanmar, Vietnam, India and Bangladesh, forecasters warned that temperatures could exceed 40C in the coming days as people endured searing heat and stifling humidity.
