



ning Commission on Thursinformed the day Balochistan High Court (BHC) that following the court orders, the Planning Commission of Pakistan released Rs 29.28 billion to the National Highway Authority (NHA) Balochistan for the dualization of N-25 Road. Imran Ali, a representative from the Planning Division, in this connection presented a letter confirming the fund release dated May 23, 2024.

On Tuesday, the Oil & Gas Regulatory Authority slashed the average prescribed gas prices of SNGPL by 10pc and SSGC by 4pc in view of the revenue requirements of the two public utilities for the next financial year. On average, SNGPL consumers should pay Rs179.17 per mmBtu less during the next fiscal year, while SSGC customers should get relief of Rs59.23 per mmBtu.

However, that will not happen where SNGPL customers are concerned, because the government intends to recover from them the tariff differential of Rs581bn not passed on to them during the last six years. Another problem arises when studies such as these separate out money supply and exchange rate depreciation. It is the price you have to pay in rupees to procure one unit of foreign currency, whether from the open or the interbank market. That is all. This is not rocket science. During these years what might otherwise be inflation in the country would be dissipated by the trade deficit, putting pressure on the reserves, which might be replenished with borrowed money. 


