The children who succumbed to their injuries were identified as Bilal, 15, Raheem, 5, Hasnain and Ayan, 1122 officials said. At least 60 people, mostly children, received serious burn injuries and had to be shifted to Karachi after being provided emergency treatment at the Liaquat University Hospital (LUH).

Under the implementation mechanism, the cooperation will be overseen by a joint steering committee, chaired by the Ministry of Interior (MOI) and comprising representatives of Interior Ministry, National Police Bureau, British High Commission (supported by the UK Home Office), the programme team and other relevant

This agreement will help establish cooperation in the ability to share international criminal conviction data and analytics to prepare pre-emptive plans for crime prevention. Improving joint collaboration to tackle illicit finance threats, detecting criminality at air and sea borders, improving ability to facilitate extradition requests from the UK to Pakistan and Pakistan to the UK are also part of the LOI.

# **Guilty:** Trump becomes first **US** president convicted of a crime

NEW YORK (INP): Donald Trump became the first U.S. president to be convicted of a crime on Thursday when a New York jury found him guilty of falsifying documents to cover up a payment to silence a porn star ahead of the 2016 election.

After two days of deliberation, the 12-member jury pronounced Trump guilty on all 34 felony counts he faced.

Trump watched the jurors dispassionately as they were polled to confirm the unanimous verdict.

Justice Juan Merchan set sentencing for July 11, just days before the Republican Party is scheduled to formally nominate Trump for president ahead of the Nov. 5 election.

The crime of falsifying business documents of four years in prison, though those convicted often receive shorter sentences, fines or probation. Incarceration would not legally prevent him from campaigning, or taking office if he were to win.

He will not be jailed ahead of sentencing.

# **Uncertain budget plans**

With the Shehbaz Sharif-led government still finetuning the next budget, it might be too early to speculate upon the contents of the document. We will have to wait for a few more days before the budget proposals are firmed up and their con-

But what is certain is that in trying to achieve a balance between its political compulsions providing succour to households no longer able to hold up against backbreaking inflation — and the necessity of plugging a deep fiscal hole in the economy, the government is faced with one of its most difficult challenges.

The confusion in the minds of the party leadership on how to deal with this paradox became even more evident on Wednesday when a PML-N meeting chaired by party leader Nawaz Sharif and attended by the prime minister decided to prepare a 'people-friendly' budget while adhering to IMF dictates. Not surprisingly, there was no official word either from the PML-N or the federal government on the outcome of the discussions. However, it is abundantly clear that the prime minister, caught between public expectations and harsh IMF demands, is in a fix.

The confusion in the PML-N over what shape the budget should take is reflective of the country's volatile political situation. On the one hand, the ruling party is not ready to lose more political capital by taking harsh measures, and on the other, it must swallow the bitter pill of stern IMF demands, if it wants to access international funding, which is crucial for reviving the economy.

At the same time, PML-N president Nawaz Sharif, who resumed his position some days ago after a long hiatus of six years following his disqualification, needs something tangible on the economic front to not just defeat the narrative of his popular arch-rival Imran Khan in Punjab but also maintain his existing public support. His party has already suffered in the February elections due to the extremely poor economic performance of the previous Shehbaz Sharif administration, which saw monthly inflation skyrocket to 38pc and interest rates jump to a record high of 22pc, besides industrial closures and job losses.

It is, therefore, safe to assume that the PML-N will do its best to meet the IMF's macroeconomic targets at the federal level, whilst taking populist measures in the Punjab budget to revive its party network in the province.

The PTI government in KP, which announced its next budget last week — much before the federal budget in a break from convention — has already shown other provinces how they can use their respective budget resources to execute the party programmes to keep their electorate happy without diverging from the IMF's conditions. There is little likelihood of other parties not giving in to this temptation.

President Joe Biden approved Ukraine using US weapons to strike targets inside Russia that were attacking the Ukrainian city of Kharkiv, after Kyiv sought authorisation from Washington in recent weeks, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken confirmed on Friday.

Speaking at a news conference in Prague after an informal meeting of Nato foreign ministers, Blinken did not specifically say whether Biden's authorisation could expand to include other Russian cities and targets deeper inside Russia. Outgunned and outmanned on the battlefield, Kyiv has been increasing pressure on its Western allies to be able to launch offensive strikes at military targets inside Russia to better repel Russian advances.

Blinken said Washington's move, a marked change in policy by Biden, who steadfastly refused to allow Ukraine to use American weaponry inside Russia, was a result of the US adjusting and adapting to the battleground. Now, he said, the US is responding to what it have a range of up to

Kharkiv region. "Over the past few

weeks, Ukraine came to us and asked for the authorisation to use weapons that we're providing to defend against this aggression, including against Russian forces that are massing on the Russian side of the border and then attacking into Ukraine," Blinken said.

"And that went right to the president, and as you've heard, he's approved [the] use of our weapons for that purpose. Going forward, we'll continue to do what we've been doing, which is as necessary adapt and adjust," Blinken said.

Kharkiv, Ukraine's second-largest city, is 30 kilometres from the border with Russia.

It is the second time this year that Biden has quietly relaxed his policy on weapons supplies for Ukraine. Earlier this year, he bent to calls to send longrange missiles known as ATACMS to Kyiv.

US officials said on Thursday that US policy would continue to prohibit the Ukrainian military from using ATACMS, which

has seen in and around the 300km, and other longrange US weapons for deep strikes inside Russia.

The US is the biggest supplier of weapons to Jkraine in its battle against the full-scale invasion launched by Russian President Vladimir Putin in February 2022.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said on Friday that Ukraine using any Western weapon to strike Russian territory is

'a question of time". "I think that using any weapon, Western kind of weapon, on the territory of Russia is a question of time. Otherwise, it is not about just peace," Zelensky told reporters on a visit to

# **NATO** ministers meet in Prague as allies ease restrictions on Ukraine's use of their weapons

**Monitoring Desk** PRAGUE: NATO foreign ministers were meeting in the Czech capital Friday to prepare for this summer's leaders' summit as the alliance boosts support for Ukraine and countries oneby-one remove restrictions on how Kyiv can use western-supplied weaponry to combat Russia's invasion.

A day after U.S. President Joe Biden gave Ukraine the go-ahead to use American munitions to strike inside Russia for the limited purpose of defending Kharkiv, numerous ministers, including those from the Netherlands, Finland, Poland and Germany, expressed approval of the decision, saying that Ukraine has the absolute right to defend itself from attacks originating on Russian soil.

The chorus of allied voices backing greater leeway for Ukraine to use their weapons grew louder in recent weeks after Russia launched artillery strikes on Kharkiv from its territory, prompting appeals for help from Kyiv. U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken had hinted strongly this week.

# Beijing wants to work with Arab states to resolve thorny issues: President Xi

**Monitoring Desk** BEIJING: China wants to work with Arab nations to resolve hot spot issues in ways conducive to upholding fairness, justice and achieving long-term peace and stability, President Xi Jinping said in a speech on Thursday that also highlighted the Gaza crisis.

China is seeking to strengthen its relations with Arab states as a model for maintaining world peace and stability, Xi was quoted as saying by state media at the China-Arab States Cooperation Forum in Beijing. In remarks about the war in Gaza, the Chinese leader said war cannot continue indefinitely, justice cannot be permanently absent and "two-state solution" should be firmly upheld.

"In the face of a turbulent world, mutual respect is the way to live in harmony, and fairness and justice are the foundation of lasting security," Xi was quoted as saying by Xinhua news.

He was addressing the heads of state of Bahrain, Egypt, the United Arab Emirates and Tunisia as well as foreign ministers from other Arab League nations. Beijing has repeatedly called for a two-state solution to the Palestinian Israeli crisis as well as an immediate ceasefire and Palestinian membership in the United Nations — positions which align closely

with those of Arab nations. China is increasingly flexing its diplomatic influence in the region, recently hosting the first talks on Chinese soil between the long-feuding Palestinian factions Hamas and Fatah in April. Last year, China also brokered a landmark reconciliation deal between Iran and Saudi Arabia after vears of hostilities between the two arch-rivals.

The Gaza crisis has threatened to push the region into a wider conflict, especially after recent titfor-tat attacks by Israel

# Sudan at 'imminent risk of famine', UN aid chiefs warn

**Monitoring Desk** GENEVA: The people of Sudan are at "imminent risk of famine", United Nations agencies said on Friday, more than a year into a war between the army and the paramilitary Rapid Sup-

port Forces (RSF).
Around 18 million people are already acutely hungry, including 3.6 million children who are acutely malnourished, according to a joint statement by UN chiefs including Volker Turk, the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights. "Time is running out for millions of people in Sudan who are at imminent risk of famine, displaced from their lands, living under bombardments, and cut off from humanitarian assistance," the statement added. Fighting broke out in the capital Khartoum

in April 2023 and quickly spread across the country, reigniting ethnic bloodshed in the western Darfur region and forcing millions to flee in the world's largest displacement crisis.

'Without an immediate and major step change, we will face a nightmare scenario: A famine will take hold in large parts of the country," read the state-ment also signed by UN aid chief Martin Griffiths.

The war broke out as long-simmering tensions over integrating the RSF with the army came to a head. The UN special adviser on the prevention of genocide said last week there was a risk of genocide in parts of Darfur. A UN-backed report said in March that immediate action was needed to "prevent widespread death and total collapse of livelihoods.

Karachi Barrister Murtaza Wahab on Friday said that the decision of the Sindh High Court regarding the collection of Municipal tric bilis is nistoric, as a result of which the Karachi Metropolitan Corporation (KMC) will receive over Rs 4.4 billion under this head during the next financial

While addressing a press conference at the Mayor's Office in Karachi, he said that the agreement for MUCT collection will be presented for approval in the meeting of the city council on June 10 and expressed hope that all parliamentary parties will cooperate in the best interest

Wahab said that after two and a half years of hard work, the court ruled in our favor in this matter. I went to court ten times in the last Utility Charges and Tax month. # Hyderabad division on high alert after positive polio samples, Intensive campaign planned

HYDERABAD (APP): polio campaign in last April. Environmental samples have tested positive for polio in three districts of the Hyderabad Division including Hyderabad,

Jamshoro and Badin.
These districts have been identified as high-risk areas, therefore a campaign should be conducted vigorously in these districts in the month of June.

This was announced by the Divisional Commissioner Hyderabad, Ahsan Ali Qureshi, during a divisional task force meeting to review preparations for the upcoming campaign.

Commissioner Qureshi highlighted the extreme heatwave in the province and stressed the importance of taking care of frontline workers by providing them with ambulances, cold water, hats, and lemon water.

During the meeting, Focal Person of the divisional task force for polio Jamshed Khanzada briefed were met during the SNID tus of Hyderabad.

He noted that the last polio case in Pakistan was reported in Qilla Abdullah, and environmental samples from three areas in Hyderabad including Tulsi Das, Qadir Nagar and Latifabad pumping stations tested positive for the po-

lio virus, which was

matched with the virus of the Quetta. Khanzada reported that in the division's nine districts, 26,635 children were still not available (SNA) for vaccination, and 1,769 children had refused the vaccine, including 1,366 refusal cases in Hyderabad. Efforts were underway with the help of the revenue

#### 48 illegal LPG filling points sealed in the district
