PM guarantees facilitation, security to Chinese investment

Stresses B2B cooperation for a bright future

SHENZHEN (APP): Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Wednesday, assuring all-out facilitation to Chinese investors, and security of Chinese individuals, projects and investments in Pakistan, emphasised that mutually rewarding business-to-business cooperation was key to a bright future for the two people.

The prime minister, addressing the Pakistan-China Business Forum during his five-day China visit, highlighted bilateral trade and investment potential, especially in key sectors including transfer of Chinese technology, industry and partnership in IT, agriculture, mining, steel, textiles and renewable energy.

The prime minister repeatedly lauded the Chinese model of development and economic transforma-

tion and vowed to replicate the same in Pakistan.

"I will go back to Pakistan with this resolve, come what may, we will follow this model of great economic transformation in Pakistan. This model is enough to copy and simulate if we are sincere to our purpose and people. By God, I can tell you this is difficult but not impossible," he told the gathering of hundreds of business leaders from Pakistan and China.

As the Business Forum also marked the B2B matchmaking, he urged the Pakistani businessmen to sit with their Chinese counterparts and find out ways to move Chinese textile industries to Pakistan and make joint collaborations in steel and other industries.

"Today is the opportunity, time and moment to capture. Sit down with Chinese friends to have serious discussions. I want to ensure you not as prime minister but as Chief Executive of Pakistan that I will give you the fullest support so that businessmen of Pakistan and China get benefits jointly," he remarked.

He informed the Forum that Pakistan had mineral deposits of around \$10 trillion while the country's exports stood at \$30 billion. The minerals deposits offer huge potential to dig out and convert them into finished and semi-finished goods for exports, he added.

He assured the Chinese side that his government had already initiated structural changes in Pakistan to control corruption.

Bilawal urges govt to focus on public issues, not Imran Khan

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari on Wednesday expressed his discontent with the politics of hate and urged the government to shift its focus from Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan to addressing public issues.

"The people of Pakistan are not interested in the politics of hatred. They want solutions to their problems. Our information department should also focus on resolving issues, not on what Imran Khan is doing. It makes no difference to people; he has his own cases to deal with," Bilawal said while speaking at a meeting of the PPP's parliamentary party in Sindh.

The PPP chairman emphasised the importance of genuine democratic behaviour, warning that the absence of such an approach leads to continual losses. "We must

focus on our work. It is our responsibility to deliver performance," he added.

Acknowledging the high expectations of the public, Bilawal said that Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah has apprised him of the challenging economic situation and uncertainty regarding funds from the federal government for various projects.

"We will make every effort [to address these challenges]. I know Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif will fulfil his promise and resolve these issues before the budget," he added.

He stressed the need to improve services within limited resources. "We must concentrate on enhancing our services with the resources we have."

Bilawal highlighted the PPP's historic success and called for relentless effort to meet public expectations. "Our ministers must work diligently and visibly."

Pakistan, Italy to undertake joint efforts against drug trafficking

ISLAMABAD (Online): Pakistan and Italy have agreed to a coordinated and effective action plan against illegal immigrants and human trafficking.

This came at a meeting between Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi and Italian Interior Minister Matteo Piantedosi in Rome. Minister for Overseas Pakistanis Chaudhry Salik Hussain was also present in the meeting.

The two sides also agreed to undertake joint efforts against drug trafficking.

Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi said steps have been taken at all levels to stop illegal entry of Pakistanis to Italy and to counter drug trafficking. A zero tolerance policy has been adopted against human trafficking and drug mafia.

PM brought innovation in CPEC: Tarar

SHENZHEN (APP): Federal Minister for Information, Broadcasting, National Heritage and Culture Attaullah Tarar on Wednesday said that Prime Minister (PM) Shehbaz Sharif had brought an innovation within China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

Talking to the media here, the minister said that a new era was beginning in CPEC under the vision of the Prime Minister. More than 500 Pakistani and Shenzhen businessmen participated in Business to Business Conference in Shenzhen, he added.

"The relations between Pakistan and China are entering a new era which is an important milestone for the Pakistani economy," the minister said.

He opined that business-to-business meetings and conferences in Shenzhen will play a significant role in the stability and development of Pakistan's economy.

FIA takes social activist Sarim Burney into custody over human trafficking charges

KARACHI (INP): The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) took social activist and entrepreneur Sarim Burney into custody from the Karachi airport on Wednesday. According to sources in the FIA, Burney was arrested by a team from the FIA Anti-Human Trafficking Wing on Wednesday afternoon following a human trafficking complaint received from the US government. It is alleged that Burney was involved in illegal adoption practices, including human trafficking, spanning across the United States, Canada and other countries.

Sources further said that Burney's activities had been under surveillance for an extended period and upon his arrival at the Karachi airport today, he was taken into custody.

A case has been officially registered against the social activist. The FIA additional director general for Karachi South added that an investigation would be conducted, taking into account all evidence and the case would be decided on its merit.

President Zardari stresses upon further strengthening Pak, Jordan bilateral ties

ISLAMABAD (APP): President Asif Ali Zardari on Wednesday said that Pakistan and Jordan enjoyed close cordial relations and stressed upon further strengthening of these bilateral ties between the two countries.

The president expressed these views during a meeting with Ambassador of Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan to Pakistan Dr Maen Khreasat who called on him, at Aiwan-e-Sadr, President Secretariat Press Wing said in a press release.

The Jordanian envoy invited the president to a conference being held in

Jordan on human relief activities in Gaza on June 11. The president assured him of Pakistan's participation in the scheduled conference.

The ambassador apprised the president that Jordan had signed memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Akhuwat Foundation for provision of relief assistance in Palestine.

The president lauded Jordan for its efforts to provide relief in Palestine. The ambassador also conveyed a felicitation message from the Jordanian King to the President Zardari on assuming his office.

Lanjar orders digitization of arms dealers' licenses and enhanced CTD measures

KARACHI (APP): Sindh Home Minister Zia-ul-Hassan Lanjar on Wednesday ordered the initiation of the process to digitize licenses for arms dealers across the province.

During his visit to the Counter Terrorism Department (CTD), he mandated that data collection and geotagging of seminars be conducted by a committee comprised of the District SSP, Special Branch, and CTD.

While assessing the CTD's performance, Zia-ul-Hassan Lanjar reviewed details of the investigation into the recent case of a youth killed during a robbery in Gulshan Iqbal. He instructed that the CTD oversee investigations of robbery-related murder cases.

He emphasized that the national action plan should be executed with its intended spirit and priorities.

The Minister guaranteed that the Sindh government would provide all necessary support and assistance to the CTD. He stressed the need for reforms and innovation within the CTD, highlighting the importance of adopting modern techniques to address emerging challenges.

During the visit, the DIGP-CTD delivered a detailed briefing on counter-terrorism measures against banned organizations, including threat assessments.

The DIGP also presented recommendations to the Minister regarding resource allocation for the CTD, construction of a regional complex, and acquisition of locators and other essential equipment.

New routes for People's Bus Service in Karachi announced

KARACHI (INP): New routes for People's Bus Service announced in Karachi. The decision was taken in a meeting chaired by Sindh Transport Minister Sharjeel Inam Memon to discuss the public transport issues of Karachi.

The meeting attended by elected MPAs from Karachi, deputy mayor and others decided to expand the routes of People's Bus Service. The new routes will be launched in Malir, Kamari, Lyari and district West of the port city.

Speaking on the occasion, Sharjeel Memon said that the government is trying to facilitate the people of the city by expanding the network of public

transport.

In the last meeting of the transport department, the minister was given a detailed briefing on the construction of various BRTs, signals, and reconstruction of bus terminals, as well as the construction of a U-turn for the People's Bus Service.

Additionally, it was decided to construct a parking plaza to reduce traffic pressure in the central areas of Hyderabad.

The transport minister was also briefed regarding the completion of the construction work of eight bus terminals. He was told that the work on the eight bus terminals has been completed and they will be functional by June.

Alternate energy usage vital for reducing environmental pollution effects: Nasir Shah

KARACHI (APP): Sindh Energy Minister Nasir Hussain Shah on Wednesday said the use of alternate energy resources should be increased to reduce environmental pollution and avoid negative effects of environment changes.

He said this in a message issued here on the occasion of World Environment Day, being observed on today across the globe.

Shah said the use of alternative energy and increase forests were indispensable to mitigate sufferings being faced by the people due to environmental pollution.

He said that the government was making all possible efforts at the national and regional level to deal with the challenges of environmental problems.

The rate of air pollution in Pakistan and especially in Sindh was alarming, Nasir Shah said and added that smoke emitting from vehicles and factory chimneys was a major cause of air pollution.

The minister was of the opinion that alternative energy was the best solution to prevent air pollution and the Sindh government was busy taking measures regarding usage of the alternate energy.

Imran Khan being asked to strike deal and leave country, claims Arif Alvi

FAISALABAD (INP): A day after clarifying his party's position on political dialogues, former president and Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) leader Dr Arif Alvi has claimed that the incarcerated party founder Imran Khan is being told to "strike a deal and leave the country". Alvi, while talking to journalists in Faisalabad on Wednesday, said that Khan rejected the offer and decided not to leave the country "at any cost".

The former president predicted that those who were colluding to sentence Khan — the former prime minister — would face a complete failure. Commenting on dialogue offers, the politico said that his party is ready to hold talks with

"stakeholders but not with the non-stakeholders". He asked the stakeholders to let go of hatred and practice compassion. Form 47 rulers are powerless who cannot make decisions, slams former president. He also said that the stakeholders should not be afraid of any kind of risks after the PTI founder's release. Alvi demanded releasing the former prime minister, the supremacy of law in the country and returning the party's mandate.

Alvi further said that his party could not hold the incumbent rulers who were as much "powerless" as they came into power via "Form 47" and didn't have "authority" to make decisions.

Omar Ayub seeks Hamood-Ur-Rehman report from FIA

ISLAMABAD (INP): Opposition leader Omar Ayub replied to the notice to FIA over the 'controversial' video uploading case on founder PTI Imran Khan's X account and asked the agency for a copy of the Hamood-Ur-Rehman Commission report.

Omar Ayub also announced to challenge the issue of the FIA notice in Parliament and challenge it in the court as well.

The defamatory notice was 'vague, dubious and illegal questions'.

Pakistan to request UAE for \$1bn loan rollover

ISLAMABAD (INP): Pakistan to 'request' United Arab Emirates (UAE) for rollover of \$1 billion loan, before maturity period, sources said on Wednesday.

As per details, the finance ministry has completed the working on the matter and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif is likely to pen down a letter to the UAE President Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed al-Nahyan, for the rollover of the loan.

Sources said, overall UAE kept \$3 billion as a safe deposit in the State Bank of Pakistan out of which \$2bn loan has already been rollover by the UAE at Pakistan's request, while a rollover for the remaining \$1 bn will be sought.

A sobering election?

It is likely to be a bittersweet victory for the BJP and its ideological cohorts in the Sangh Parivar as India finishes counting the votes from its massive electoral exercise.

While Narendra Modi is poised to form his third consecutive government, electoral trends at the time of writing indicate that the BJP and its allies will be nowhere near translating their boastful claims of winning 400 seats in the Lok Sabha into reality.

The projections predict a simple, albeit thin, majority for the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance. The INDIA grouping, led by Congress, has made surprising gains, with a likely tally of around 200 seats. It should be remembered that in 2019, Congress was walloped; in fact, India's grand old party has spent the last decade in the political wilderness, as the BJP played up the Hindutva card, tearing apart the political structure built by Nehru and Gandhi. But the latest results indicate that things may be changing.

For the BJP, Muslim-baiting and communal rhetoric appear to have backfired, even in its political heartland or 'Hindi belt'. Instead of praising the glory of a new Hindu rashtra, Indian voters were more concerned about pressing issues, such as jobs and the cost of living.

The Ram Mandir, inaugurated by Mr Modi in January, may have been a grand spectacle, but tens of millions of voters were clearly not swayed by this dangerous mixing of politics, mythology and communalism. Mr Modi's hounding of India's Muslims — the anti-Muslim rhetoric was particularly pronounced during the poll campaign — has failed to translate into electoral dividends for the Sangh this time around.

It is hoped that the sobering election results lead to a dialling down of the inflammatory rhetoric against Muslims, and that the toxic communalism that has been promoted in India for political gains over the last decade is discarded.

Coming to relations with Pakistan, from 2019 onwards, bilateral ties have been at their lowest in decades under Mr Modi's watch. India's unilateral decision to annex held Kashmir has perhaps been the biggest obstacle standing in the way of better ties. Moreover, Mr Modi and his ministers have also used provocative language aimed at Pakistan, including during the election campaign, which has hardly served the cause of peace. Once the dust settles in Delhi and the BJP forms the next government, we hope that Narendra Modi reviews his foreign policy. India should reach out to Pakistan, and the state should respond positively to any Indian overtures. Naturally, rebuilding trust will take time, but long-term peace in South Asia is impossible without better Pakistan-India ties. India cannot skirt around the Kashmir question; both sides should at least start talking, even if they agree to disagree. Let India's incoming government start afresh with Pakistan.

Modi's hat-trick

At the cusp of yesterday, most of his troubles seemed so far away. The published exit polls pointed to a third landslide for Narendra Modi and his allies, even though the aspiration of 400-plus seats seemed far-fetched. The INDIA bloc-led opposition was justifiably sceptical about the projections.

There was never much doubt about Modi's hat-trick — the likelihood that he would become the first prime minister since Jawaharlal Nehru to win three elections in a row. His Bharatiya Janata Party's vote share, however, has never come close to the Congress tally between 1951 and 1962 — which always fell short of 50pc. Even when the Congress registered its highest percentage under Rajiv Gandhi in 1984, in the wake of his mother's assassination (and the appalling anti-Sikh pogroms that followed), it's unprecedented tally of 404 seats (out of 514) was based on 49pc of the popular vote.

As in all other first-past-the-post set-ups, the number of Lok Sabha seats a party or alliance wins does not have to match its percentage of votes. The same barrier to a more representative democracy applies in Britain — which may have to take the overdue leap into some form of proportional representation before former colonies such as India and Pakistan follow suit.

This year's polls in India were extended across six weeks — an unnecessarily long ordeal. In the customary publicity surrounding the polls that involve the world's largest electorate, some attention (as usual) was focused on, for example, how far electoral officials trek to obtain a handful of votes from barely accessible outposts. There were also reported instances — notably in UP — of Muslim voters being brusquely (and often violently) turned away from polling stations.

Nonetheless, at the time of writing, the INDIA bloc appeared to have a decisive lead in UP — a setback for the state's obnoxious chief minister, Yogi Adityanath. INDIA also boasted a substantial lead in Maharashtra, and the NDA's dreams of inroads into Kerala and Tamil Nadu appeared to have been put on hold.

Likewise, the 'chaar sau paar' (more than 400) illusion appears to have fallen short by about 100. Modi spent 45 hours during the final stage of the election in a 'meditation' retreat in Tamil Nadu, apparently surviving on coconut water and grape juice (one can only wonder about the vintage); his 'isolation' heralded by dozens of TV cameras. Notwithstanding his desperate claims of divinity (or at least a divinely inspired mission), a sizeable chunk of the electorate appears to have decided that this would-be deity is encumbered by feet of clay.

Those who feared that another thumping majority lay in store have been pleasantly surprised. Even though a Modi exit remains distant, it seems closer than it appeared a few weeks ago. Since his advent as PM a decade ago, Modi has been courted and feted by Western counterparts who ought to have known better. His overbearing demeanour and attitude may not change in the near future. But his comeuppance in the latest polls may spell the beginning of the end for the RSS stranglehold in Delhi.

There are no grounds for complacency, but India appears to be on a more hopeful trajectory. The initial winner of three successive elections, Nehru, was a dedicated foe of

communalism in both its Hindu and Muslim manifestations. He noted more than once in his autobiography, though, that the relative dignity of the Muslim communalists was not reflected among their Hindu counterparts. Notwithstanding the 'pandit' title he inherited, Nehru was devoutly irreligious — but well aware that several of his Congress colleagues harboured co-munal prejudices beneath their secular garb.

He would have been disappointed by several of his successors at the helm of the Congress, possibly including his daughter and grandson, both of whom suffered brutal deaths. He might have found cause for pride, though, in the endeavours of his great-grandson. Whether or not Rahul Gandhi will ever be PM is not written in the stars, and dynastic politics are in many ways a curse in the subcontinent and the rest of Asia.

A few decades ago, India looked like a plausible role model to Pakistanis irked by their nation's descent into military-sponsored religious fundamentalism. India turned the tables by going the same way in 2014. Pakistan has never quite turned away from the obscurantism it encountered after July 1977. At a stretch, Indian voters have now indicated that that formula in the Hindu context, particularly when it fails to deliver the promised levels of employment and levelling up. Modi will henceforth be a depleted leader, and the justifiably reviled Amit Shah might have reached the end of his tether.

The BJP-led coalition is expected to rule for the next five years. But, given current trends, it might not stretch that far. Fingers crossed. — Courtesy Dawn

Upended by climate

A new global stocktaking report released today by Unicef shows that climate change is impacting almost every aspect of child health and well-being, from pregnancy to adolescence. Nowhere is the impact more visible than on children in Pakistan, which recorded the wettest April this year in over 60 years. Torrential and unseasonal rains swept through Pakistan, killing 144 people. In KP, 33 children died; 24 injured were children.

In 2022, I saw firsthand how 10 years' worth of rains were dumped on villages in southern Sindh, triggered by climate change. Five hundred children lost their lives due to unprecedented rainfall, the highest recorded since 1961. The rain swallowed 12-year-old Mehreen's house and belongings. Together with her parents and four siblings, Mehreen lived in a makeshift shelter for months. I met hundreds of children like Mehreen, whose lives were upended by the floods.

Despite aid efforts, almost 9.6 million children still needed humanitarian assistance in flood-affected areas in December 2023. Many children didn't have enough food to eat or safe water to drink. Thousands were malnourished. Living and working in Pakistan, I am an eyewitness to the devastation caused by climate change. Year on year, children in Pakistan are caught in a vicious cycle of drought, water scarcity and floods. From the moment of conception until they grow into adulthood, the health and development of children's brains, lungs, and immune systems are affected by their environment.

Children are more likely to suffer from air pollution than adults, leading to life-threatening

respiratory diseases. As a result, about 12 per cent of deaths in Pakistani children under five are due to air pollution. Children suffer unequally because of global warming. Poorer children simply don't have the ability to cope like the privileged. In fact, the hardest-hit districts in Pakistan are amongst the most vulnerable. With an event like the 2022 floods, we could expect to see an 18pc increase in the prevalence of child marriage, which could erase five years of progress.

I am also concerned. As a father of four children, I worry about their future and that of every child and generation who will inherit from us. Despite children's unique vulnerability to climate change, only 2.4pc of climate finance from climate funds supports projects for children. In September 2022, for the first time, the United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child published General Comment 26, recognising children's rights to live in a clean, healthy, and sustainable environment.

While I am an eyewitness, I am also a polluter. As an emitter with a carbon footprint, I contribute to climate change with my choices, work and sheer existence. Every time I eat, consume, buy or travel, I add to global emissions. But blame does not fall equally. According to Oxfam, the world's richest 10pc is responsible for half of all global emissions. That, among other things, is heating up the planet. Everyone is accountable — individuals, families, businesses, and activists. We need to act on climate change beyond emergency relief for the Pakistan floods. We need to plan over the long term. This is everyone's business.

For the first time, decision-makers at COP28 in Dubai paid at-

attention to the unique impacts of climate change on children's health and well-being. They proposed an 'expert dialogue' at COP30. Now we urge world leaders to work towards making COP30 a children's COP — where we secure the 1.5 degrees Celsius temperature limit that the next generation needs. But as a collective, we can and must do more.

First, businesses must review practices that pollute the water and air, and companies should play a stronger role in reducing fossil fuels. Second, world leaders should take climate finance seriously. It can give countries, parents and social workers the power to help children deal with climate change. That means more money to build schools, wells, tanks, and health centres that can withstand climate shocks such as floods and cyclones. Third, for our children's future, financing mechanisms like the Loss and Damage Fund should be even more responsive to the needs of children.

If nothing changes, in 2030, emissions will be 22 gigatonnes higher than the 1.5°C limit will allow. Many more children could die, and the climate catastrophes will not be confined to vulnerable countries like Pakistan. Radical action is needed now. So, I ask every person and organisation to reflect on what they can do. Personally, I am making a commitment to go plastic-free, recycle more, buy more consciously, and conserve energy use. What will you do?

Israel strikes, shelling kill 19 in Gaza amid manoeuvring on ceasefire quest

CAIRO: Israeli shelling and airstrikes killed at least 19 people in central and south Gaza on Tuesday including two policemen who were helping protect humanitarian aid deliveries in the southern city of Rafah, Palestinian medicals said. Seventeen of the deaths, they said, occurred in separate Israeli airstrikes on the al-Bureij and al-Maghazi refugee camps and the city of Deir-al-Balah in central Gaza, and by late Tuesday tanks were shelling an area just east of the al-Nusseirat camp, residents said. Some told Reuters via chat app that the renewed Israeli military push was sowing panic, with some families living in al-Maghazi starting to flee under tank fire, with four shells crashing near a clinic in the camp. In a brief statement issued earlier in the day, the

Israeli military said jets were hitting Hamas targets in central Gaza while ground forces were operating "in a focused manner with guidance from intelligence" in the al-Bureij area. It gave no update on activity in Rafah, into which Israeli forces swept last month in what the military calls a limited operation to root out Hamas' last intact combat units after almost eight months of devastating war in the Gaza Strip. The small city fringing Gaza's southern border with Egypt had been sheltering about one million Palestinians who fled Israeli assaults in other parts of the enclave, but most have fled again in the face of Israel's tank-led advance. Israel launched an air and ground offensive in Gaza last October vowing to destroy Hamas after fighters stormed across the border into southern Israel on Oct. 7, killing around

Russia to provide more military aid, instructors to Burkina Faso

MOSCOW: Russia will send additional military supplies and instructors to Burkina Faso to help the West African country boost its defence capabilities and fight terrorism, Russian state media quoted Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov as saying on Wednesday. Burkina Faso, under military leadership since a 2022 coup, has played host to contingents of the Wagner mercenary force, whose founder Yevgeny Prigozhin was killed in a plane crash last August. "From the very first contacts between our countries after President (Ibrahim) Traore came to power, we have been very closely engaged in all areas of cooperation, including the development of military and military-technical ties," TASS news agency cited Lavrov as saying during a visit to Burkina Faso. "I have no doubt that thanks to this cooperation, the remaining pockets of terrorism on the territory of Burkina Faso will be destroyed," he told a press conference in the capital Ouagadougou. Lavrov has made a series of visits to Africa since the start of the war in Ukraine as Russia, hit by Western sanctions, seeks new trade partners and tries to rally developing countries behind its vision of a "multipolar world" no longer dominated by the United States and former European colonial powers.

South African minister Kodwa appears in court on graft charges

JOHANNESBURG: South Africa's outgoing minister of sports, arts and culture Zizi Kodwa appeared in court on Wednesday after being arrested on corruption charges, police said. Kodwa served in President Cyril Ramaphosa's cabinet up until last week's election, which saw the African National Congress (ANC) lose its majority for the first time in 30 years of democracy. He was appointed sports, arts and culture minister last year after being deputy minister of state security. He was ANC spokesperson from 2014 to 2017. Kodwa was granted bail during a hearing at a magistrate's court in Johannesburg, elite police unit the Hawks said in a statement. His lawyer said he would not evade trial and would disclose his defence at a later stage, footage by public broadcaster SABC showed. Local news website News24 reported that he intended to plead not guilty. The charges against Kodwa stem from a judicial inquiry into alleged corruption during former president Jacob Zuma's time in office.

Germany considers expelling Afghans after knife attack

BERLIN: Germany said on Tuesday it was considering allowing deportations to Afghanistan, after an asylum seeker from the country injured five and killed a police officer in a knife attack. Officials had been carrying out an "intensive review for several months... to allow the deportation of serious criminals and dangerous individuals to Afghanistan", Interior Minister Nancy Faeser told journalists. "It is clear to me that people who pose a potential threat to Germany's security must be deported quickly," Faeser said. "That is why we are doing everything possible to find ways to deport criminals and dangerous people to both Syria and Afghanistan," she said. Deportations to Afghanistan have been completely stopped since the Taliban retook power in 2021.

US says response from Hamas on ceasefire proposal still awaited

WASHINGTON: A response from Palestinian Islamist group Hamas on Israel's ceasefire proposal that US President Joe Biden revealed on Friday is still being awaited, White House national security adviser Jake Sullivan told reporters on Tuesday. "We are waiting for a response from Hamas" through the Qatari mediators, Sullivan said. CIA Director Bill Burns will be in Doha to consult with Qatari mediators on the Gaza ceasefire proposal, Sullivan added. Qatar has been mediating on Gaza between Israel and Hamas. Qatar said on Tuesday it had delivered the Israeli ceasefire proposal to Hamas that reflected a three-phase proposal presented by Biden, and that the paper was now much closer to the positions of both sides.

Plan to start working from new capital city in July: Indonesia

JAKARTA: Indonesia's President Joko "Jokowi" Widodo said on Wednesday he plans to start working from the new capital city next month amid concerns over the future of the project following the resignations of senior executives overseeing the development. Jokowi said the progress of several infrastructure developments under the first phase of the \$32 billion capital city, called Nusantara, on Borneo island.

Syrian man arrested near US embassy in Beirut: army

BEIRUT: A Syrian man was arrested after a shooting on Wednesday near the US embassy in Beirut, the Lebanese army said, with the diplomatic mission saying its personnel were safe. The embassy, in the northern suburb of Awkar, "was subjected to gunfire by a person holding Syrian nationality", the army said in a statement on X, formerly Twitter.

Ukrainian official in Beijing urges China to attend peace summit

BEIJING: Ukraine's first deputy foreign minister visited China on Wednesday and urged it to send a delegation to a planned summit on Ukraine this month in Switzerland, in the apparent hope it was still possible to persuade China to attend. Russia has not been invited to participate in the June 15-16 meeting, Beijing has so far said it will stay away, describing the attendance of both warring sides as a prerequisite for any substantive peace conference. "The Ukrainian side expressed hope that China's participation in the event could be a good opportunity to make a practical contribution to achieving a just and lasting peace in Ukraine," the Ukrainian foreign ministry said following a meeting in Beijing between First Deputy Foreign Minister Andriy Sybiha and Chinese Vice Foreign Minister Sun Weidong. Kyiv says more than 100 countries have accepted its invitation to the summit to discuss provisions of a peace plan outlined by President Volodymyr Zelenskyy to end the full-scale Russian invasion now in its third year. Moscow has ridiculed the idea of a summit without its participation as pointless. Ukraine has accused Moscow of trying to disrupt the conference. China proclaimed a "no limits" partnership with Russia just days before Moscow launched its full-scale invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, but portrays itself as neutral in the conflict.

Modi set to take PM oath for 3rd time on June 8 as allies pledge support

NEW DELHI: Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi is expected to be sworn-in for a record-equalling third term on June 8, after key allies pledged their continued support a day after a humbling election verdict that saw his party lose its majority in parliament. Modi, a populist who has dominated Indian politics since coming to power in 2014, will for the first time need the support of regional allies whose loyalties have wavered over the years, which could complicate the government's reform agenda. On Wednesday,

Modi's Hindu-nationalist Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) agreed with coalition allies to form a government. "We all unanimously choose respected National Democratic Alliance (NDA) leader Narendra Modi as our leader," the BJP-issued alliance statement read. "The NDA government under the leadership of Modi is committed to serving the poor, women, youth, farmers and exploited, deprived and oppressed citizens of India."
