As per the budget documents and mentioned by the Finance Minister in his budget speech, Balochistan is set to receive Rs. 862 billion from transfers and the divisible pool.

The budget has allocated over Rs. 93 billion for law and order, over Rs. 146 billion for education, and over Rs. 67 billion for health sectors.

As per the budget at a glance, over Rs. 138 billion

ture and religion sectors. According to the budget document, Balochistan would get over Rs. 862 billion from the revenue receipts including Rs. 726 billion from the federal government receipts. These are included over Rs. 647 billion from the divisible pool, over Rs. 20 billion from the straight transfers, over Rs. 20 million from the non-development grants and over Rs. 59 billion from the development grants.

The total provincial own receipts are estimated in the budget as over Rs. 124 billion. These are included: over Rs. 47 billion from the provincial tax re- budget, he added.

have been allocated for the ceipts, over Rs. 18 billion from the provincial non-tax receipts and over Rs. 58 billion from the provincial non-tax receipts (including the lease extension bonus).

Similarly, the capital receipts in the budget are estimated as over Rs. 69 billion. These are included over Rs. 21 billion (recoveries of loans, advances and investments), over Rs. 17 billion (foreign project assistance – loan) and over Rs. 30 billion (projects financing).

The Minister Finance announced that the salaries and pensions of the government employees and pensioners have been increased on the pattern of federal government.

He mentioned that 25

percent increase has been proposed in the salaries of government employees of Grade-1 to 16 while 22 percent increase has been proposed in the salaries of government employees serving in Grade-17 to 22. Besides, 15 percent increase has been proposed in the pensions of retired provincial government employees in the next financial year's the surplus.

NEPRA proposes fixed charges up to Rs 1,000 for domestic electricity users

SLAMABAD (INP): NEPRA has proposed introducing fixed charges for domestic electricity consumers, starting from July , potentially impacting millions of households na-

According to sources the proposal has been submitted to the federal government for final approval. The proposed fixed charges are integrated into the average basic electricity tariff.

The charges are tiered based on monthly consumption: Rs 200 for 301-400 units, Rs 400 for 401-500 units, Rs 600 for 501-600 units, Rs 800 for 601-700 units, and Rs 1,000 for usage above 700 units. Previously, fixed charges were not included in the tariff for domestic customers. The final decision on the new tariff structure will be made following the federal government's review.

This year, too, while the HEC budget did not go up, salaries went up by 20 per cent and inflation has been around 15pc. Publicsector universities. which the agency funds, will continue to hurt and the hurt will keep getting deeper. Some might face default on salary or pension payments as

But this year's budget has more bad news for the higher education sector. Teachers and researchers had a 25pc income tax rebate (it was 50pc for the first few years) that had been given a couple of decades back. This has been taken away in this budget. This implies even if universities give a 15pc raise this year, with the removal of the rebate and with the income tax slab adjustments that have

teachers/researchers, the strike not-for-profit latter will have less universities. Currently, take-home than they did last year. And these are times of high inflation!

We have a shortage of teachers in Pakistan. At the higher education level, it has been hard to find or hold on to faculty. Our application pools have dwindled. Those with PhD degrees do not want to come back to Pakistan, and many of those who are here want to leave. Many have left, and many others continue to look for opportunities abroad

Hitting the salaries of teachers and researchers in this manner and in these times clearly shows that the government does not attach much priority to education despite all the rhetoric about an education emergency. It is not as if this measure is going to give the government any sizable amount of revenue. But it will have a big impact on individuals who have been hit and on universities and their budgets.

the tax commissioner is empowered to issue exemption certificates in cases where a person's income is exempt from tax as is the case with not-for-profit universities. These universities rely on this certificate to ensure that no tax is withheld on their behalf by withholding agents.

The Finance Bill

2024 proposes to withdraw the commissioner's power to issue exemption at 100pc and allows him/her to only issue exemptions at a lower rate. This will hurt in two ways. For not-for-profit universities this means that tax will be held in their name but they will not be able to adjust this tax as they will not have any tax liability to adjust against at the end of the year. And getting refunds from the FBR is not easy and everyone knows that it will not happen. So, the working capital needs of universities will be hurt and a liability will be created against the FBR for no

If all of this were not enough, the govern-ment, in its belief that the Pakistani people read too much and should be doing other things, has raised the general sales tax on books. Books have become a lot more expensive over the last two to three years due to a) an increase in the price of paper and b) devaluation. As it is, the local book business is not a huge one and the recent price hikes have hit it badly.

Almost five months since one of the most manipulated general elections in our checkered history, there is an ominous quiet before yet another impending storm. What form it takes is unknown, but it is clear that the current hybrid regime is devoid of legitimacy and has neither the will nor the capacity to resolve Pakistan's many structural crises.

The PTI is convinced that it is the answer to Pakistan's problems, and can viably claim to being the party with the most popular support across what is an extremely divided polity. But for all of the repression that the PTI has experienced over the past two years, there is little lynching campaigns evidence that it would be able to lead a process of structural change to overhaul Pakistan's militarised political economy and state ideology and resolve deeply rooted class, gender and ethnic-national contradictions.

Those political forces that I believe do offer at least the ideological depth and political commitment to challenge the establishment-centric order are not sufficiently strong to do so. In this category are some ethnicnationalist forces — particularly youth-led moveas well as the ments political left.

So we are faced with a medium-term prognosis of deepening structural crises while mainstream parties slug it out in a zero-sum game for governmental power. There is also the resurgence of religious militancy of ferent geographies of the

Such groups not only do the politics of hate, they also undertake welfare and other societal activities that deepens their social base in the absence of state-led welfare and recreational schemes. The way in which the current regime treated import scandal, unrelenting inflation and unemployment, as well as the disdain for workers' rights and unionisation tell us that the potential pool of support for militant organisations will only grow.

None of this will happen through wishful thinking. It requires conscious recognition of the situation we face and viable strategies to redress it. It is under this backdrop that hateful ideologies and molecular violence are deepening across the social formation.


