QUETTA: The Balochistan's annual surplus budget having total volume of Rs. 955.602 billion for the next financial year 2024-25 was presented in the provincial assembly here on Friday.

The Provincial Minister for Finance, Mir Shoaib Nausherwani unveiled the maiden budget of the Chief Minister, Mir Sarfraz Ahmed Bugti-led coalition government while the Speaker, Captain (Retd)

Abdul Khalq Achakzai was in chair and the Chief Minister in attendance.

As per the budget documents and mentioned by the Finance Minister in his budget speech, Balochistan is set to receive Rs. 862 billion from transfers and the divisible pool.

The budget has allocated over Rs. 93 billion for law and order, over Rs. 146 billion for education, and over Rs. 67 billion for health sectors.

As per the budget at a glance, over Rs. 138 billion

for development expenditures.

have been allocated for the general public service, over Rs. 93 billion for the public order and safety affairs, over Rs. 79 billion for economic affairs, over Rs. 909 million for the environment protection, over Rs. 49 billion for the housing and community amenities, over Rs. 67 billion for the health sector; over Rs. 146 billion for the education affairs and services, over Rs. 13 billion for the social protection and over Rs. 6 billion for recreational, culture and religion sectors.

According to the budget document, Balochistan would get over Rs. 862 billion from the revenue receipts including Rs. 726 billion from the federal government receipts. These are included over Rs. 647 billion from the divisible pool, over Rs. 20 billion from the straight transfers, over Rs. 20 million from the non-development grants and over Rs. 59 billion from the development grants.

The total provincial

own receipts are estimated in the budget as over Rs. 124 billion. These are included: over Rs. 47 billion from the provincial tax re-

ceipts, over Rs. 18 billion from the provincial non-tax receipts and over Rs. 58 billion from the provincial non-tax receipts (including the lease extension bonus).

Similarly, the capital receipts in the budget are estimated as over Rs. 69 billion. These are included over Rs. 21 billion (recoveries of loans, advances and investments), over Rs. 17 billion (foreign project assistance – loan) and over Rs. 30 billion (projects financing).

The Minister Finance announced that the salaries and pensions of the government employees and pensioners have been increased on the pattern of federal government.

He mentioned that 25 percent increase has been proposed in the salaries of government employees of Grade-1 to 16 while 22 percent increase has been proposed in the salaries of government employees serving in Grade-17 to 22. Besides, 15 percent increase has been proposed in the pensions of retired provincial government employees in the next financial year's budget, he added.

NEPRA proposes fixed charges up to Rs 1,000 for domestic electricity users

ISLAMABAD (APP): NEPRA has proposed introducing fixed charges for domestic electricity consumers, starting from July 1, potentially impacting millions of households nationwide.

According to sources, the proposal has been submitted to the federal government for final approval. The proposed fixed charges are integrated into the average basic electricity tariff.

The charges are tiered based on monthly consumption: Rs 200 for 301-400 units, Rs 400 for 401-500 units, Rs 600 for 501-600 units, Rs 800 for 601-700 units, and Rs 1,000 for usage above 700 units. Previously, fixed charges were not included in the tariff for domestic customers. The final decision on the new tariff structure will be made following the federal government's review.

Liu Jianchao highlighted that he is visiting Pakistan as a follow up of the successful meetings between the leadership of the two countries in China.



Budget 2024-25: PPP excuses unconditional support to PML-N

ISLAMABAD (INP): Pakistan People's Party (PPP) has excused unconditional support to Pakistan Muslim League Nawaz (PML-N) led federal government on Budget 2024-25.

According to media reports, the meeting between Prime Minister Shehzad Sharif and Bilawal Bhutto Zardari, Chairman of Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP), did not yield any positive results as PPP did not assure the Prime Minister of their cooperation on the budget. Sources said that the party has stuck to its previous stance on its demands. The government had requested PPP's support in passing the budget 2024-25, but PPP has demanded implementation of the written agreement on their demands before offering any support. Sources said that the government has not provided a deadline to accept PPP's demands.

Yesterday, PPP Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari called on Prime Minister Shehzad Sharif to discuss the former's reservations over the budget 2024-25. The prime minister urged all political parties to work together for the development and prosperity of the country and public welfare.

BHC terms decision of cabinet regarding wheat procurement at subsidized rates as illegal

QUETTA: The Balochistan High Court (BHC) has termed the decision of provincial cabinet to procure wheat at subsidized rates after allocating Rs. 500 million as illegal and directed to the Chief Secretary to defer the said amount towards payment of loan and establishment of technical center, town planning and supply of drinking water, etc. as suggested by the Chief Minister. The BHC announced the judgement on a petition in which the validity of decision taken by the provincial cabinet regarding procurement of wheat from Nasirabad division after allocation of Rs. 500 million at subsidized rates despite bumper wheat crops in the country. The division bench headed by the Chief Justice,

Mr. Justice Muhammad Hashim Khan Kakar had heard the constitutional petition. In its judgment, the High Court observed that we find that the decision of the provincial cabinet does not meet the standards of reasonableness, non-discrimination and prudent financial management. For the aforesaid reasons, the petitions are allowed and the decision of the provincial cabinet to procure wheat at subsidized rates after allocating 500 million rupees stands illegal.

KP's 'power struggle'

An ongoing dispute between Peshawar and Islamabad over loadshedding in KP has flared up once again, with the provincial government now demanding that power cuts not exceed 12 hours in any area.

However, though the PTI's stance appears to be 'pro-people', it also risks creating impediments in the fight against electricity theft, and the party will soon realise it should reconsider its policy on the matter.

It is pertinent to mention here that PESCO, which powers most parts of KP, is among those distribution companies that regularly report high theft and loss of electricity, with 'line losses' climbing to as high as 60pc on average on its network. This means that PESCO customers, on average, pay only Rs4 for every Rs10 of electricity they consume. The rest is picked up by other bill-paying customers across the country, as it is factored into the uniform national tariff.

To penalise delinquency in the payment of bills, many electricity distribution companies have been imposing loadshedding in low-recovery areas, due to which even bill-paying customers may suffer hours of no electricity for no fault of their own. The same is true for those in KP who are dutifully paying their bills but still suffering because PESCO is unable to recover the money others owe.

However, while Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur's gung-ho response to his province's electricity crisis may endear him to his party's supporters, he seems to be taking a counterproductive approach to an issue that needs to be resolved responsibly.

Instead of emboldening protesters who keep breaking into electricity grid stations, Mr Gandapur should encourage his provincial subjects to clear their due bills and use his authority to ensure that theft is minimised. This seems to be the surest way of ensuring that honest citizens do not continue to suffer.

To be fair, the KP government does seem to realise where the problem lies: just last month, it amicably concluded discussions with the federal government on the same matter. However, the onset of summer has brought with it immense public pressure for a quick resolution to the loadshedding issue, which is a tall order given the complexities of the economics of electricity supply.

Mr Gandapur has suggested on multiple occasions that the dues owed to KP by the centre should be used to offset the province's electricity liabilities, but while he is justified in seeking his province's fair share, it appears unlikely that it will materialise given the centre's severe resource constraints.

Both Peshawar and Islamabad must, therefore, find a way out of the mess. Till then, however, protesters must not be allowed to interfere with the electricity grid. It seems dangerous and irresponsible and should not be condoned by the KP government.

When the government first announced that it was cutting the budget for higher education, and later, with great magnanimity, announced it would restore it to last year's level, it reminded me of this story. And the government also expects us to be thankful.

The number of universities keeps going up as provincial and federal governments bestow new charters and upgrade colleges. But the Higher Education

Commission's funds have not been increased for several years. This despite the inflation. It is not surprising that many universities, even the more established, older ones, are under grave financial stress.

This year, too, while the HEC budget did not go up, salaries went up by 20 per cent and inflation has been around 15pc. Public-sector universities, which the agency funds, will continue to hurt and the hurt will keep getting deeper. Some might face default on salary or pension payments as well.

But this year's budget has more bad news for the higher education sector. Teachers and researchers had a 25pc income tax rebate (it was 50pc for the first few years) that had been given a couple of decades back. This has been taken away in this budget. This implies even if universities give a 15pc raise this year, with the removal of the rebate and with the income tax slab adjustments that have been imposed on salaried

teachers/researchers, the latter will have less take-home than they did last year. And these are times of high inflation!

We have a shortage of teachers in Pakistan. At the higher education level, it has been hard to find or hold on to faculty. Our application pools have dwindled. Those with PhD degrees do not want to come back to Pakistan, and many of those who are here want to leave. Many have left, and many others continue to look for opportunities abroad.

Hitting the salaries of teachers and researchers in this manner and in these times clearly shows that the government does not attach much priority to education despite all the rhetoric about an education emergency. It is not as if this measure is going to give the government any sizable amount of revenue. But it will have a big impact on individuals who have been hit and on universities and their budgets.

Another taxation proposal is also set to

strike not-for-profit universities. Currently, the tax commissioner is empowered to issue exemption certificates in cases where a person's income is exempt from tax as is the case with not-for-profit universities. These universities rely on this certificate to ensure that no tax is withheld on their behalf by withholding agents.

The Finance Bill 2024 proposes to withdraw the commissioner's power to issue exemption at 100pc and allows him/her to only issue exemptions at a lower rate. This will hurt in two ways. For not-for-profit universities this means that tax will be held in their name but they will not be able to adjust this tax as they will not have any tax liability to adjust against at the end of the year. And getting refunds from the FBR is not easy and everyone knows that it will not happen. So, the working capital needs of universities will be hurt and a liability will be created against the FBR for no reason.

This change will

also create opportunities for nepotism, favouritism and rishwat where commissioners will be lobbied to issue exemption certificates at a higher percentage rate. It is a harsh proposal that will not give the government any revenue and will not raise tax income but will open the door for lobbying for refunds as well — again, leading to more graft and nepotism.

If all of this were not enough, the government, in its belief that the Pakistani people read too much and should be doing other things, has raised the general sales tax on books. Books have become a lot more expensive over the last two to three years due to a) an increase in the price of paper and b) devaluation. As it is, the local book business is not a huge one and the recent price hikes have hit it badly.

The rise in GST will hurt even more. Imported books have become expensive and retailers have been seeing the impact. Raising GST on books will make it even more difficult to sell books. Educationists

were already very concerned about the lack of a reading culture vis-à-vis our youth. On the one hand and as part of the education emergency, the government has been introducing 'reading' hours in schools to improve foundational learning, and on the other, GST on books has been raised.

More taxes are needed. But it cannot be a policy that we just impose taxes blindly whenever we see an opportunity to be able to extract or extort taxes. We have to realise that taxes have consequences. We are doing poorly in education already. We have been cutting funding for higher education and funding for school education is barely keeping up with inflation. Parents are hurting due to rising tuition fees and other costs.

To hit the education sector through the various tax measures mentioned seems very unfair. One hopes that the Senate and House debate on the budget will take these issues into consideration. -- Courtesy Dawn

Pakistan's Hobbesian nightmare

Human history is replete with governance innovations. Some of these have changed the course of history. But perhaps none was as cataclysmic and transformational as the founding of the 'nation state'. There were two primary sources of the rise of the nation state: power struggle between the Italian city states and the Church, and the intellectual contribution of the 'scholastic' school of thought, both aimed at freeing the affairs of men from the centuries-old ecclesiastical moorings regarding thought and life.

But if the affairs of men were to be governed by practical considerations, what ought to be the justification of having a set-up (government) that is substitute for one based on divine law?

Scholars and philosophers of the later medieval period remained seized with this question for some time. Of the earliest attempts to furnish an answer, two came from Niccolo Machiavelli (1469-1527) and Thomas Hobbes (1588-1679).

The Florentine diplomat and political adviser, Machiavelli, was crystal clear on the raison d'être of the existence of a government (or sovereign). In his celebrated book, *The Prince*, he stated: "He ought accordingly to encourage his subjects by enabling them to pursue their callings, whether mercantile, agricultural, or any other, in security so that this man shall not be deterred from beautifying his possessions from the apprehension that they may be taken from him, or that other refrain from opening a trade through fear of taxes; and he should provide rewards for those who desire so to employ themselves, and for all who are disposed in any way to add to the greatness of his City or State."

(Three centuries later, the same was to be restated by the celebrated Adam Smith, albeit in slightly different words.) Hobbes' advocacy of a state was born more out of his fears. Like Machiavelli, he acknowledged that people have an innate desire to better their lot through the acquisition of riches. Various groups of people have a

tendency to establish a social equilibrium among themselves, which keeps the wheels of development and commerce well-oiled.

Hobbes, though, foresaw that a particular group may have an incentive to break that equilibrium in order to establish its hegemony or to impose its will. To keep that fine balance between different groups intact, he advocated giving the state the monopoly on violence. Otherwise, as he wrote, life would be "nasty, brutish and short".

You do not need to be an Einstein to grasp the role of the state in light of what Machiavelli and Hobbes eschewed. Let us then start with the most fundamental aspect: how safe are we as citizens?

Just before Eidul Fitri and recently, Islamabad, the federal capital, witnessed record crime, which is but a small reflection of what is happening around the country. Its entire police force and more than 2,000 'safe city' cameras could do nothing to stop it.

The plight of Pakistan's main commercial hub, Karachi, is well-known: killings occur daily during muggings and petty theft has been the norm for decades. The same is the case for all other urban centres.

What of "the apprehension that they may be taken from him"? There is little or no enforcement of property or intellectual rights in Pakistan. Properties are forcefully occupied or taken, and people are picked up by the 'deep state' at will.

What of the "refrain from opening a trade through fear of taxes"?

The state's oppressive, extractive taxation system ensures that a huge informal economy prevails and citizens are put under an increasing burden of taxes to finance an unproductive Leviathan that guzzles money to preserve its colonial ways (read PIDEPRISE Tax Reform Commission report).

Lastly, what of the "rewards for those who desire so to employ themselves, and for all who are disposed in any way to add to the greatness of his City or State"? How about Dr Abdus Salam, who put Pakistan on the map of Nobel Prize winners? How did the Pakistani state and its people reward him?

ward him? Short of hanging him in public, we did (and still are) doing everything to tarnish his legacy and achievements!

What may sound trite, but the profound repercussions of an unsafe, risky Pakistan are hardly understood. Theft, robberies and pilferage, be it by governments or individuals, constitute a transfer of hard-earned wealth.

If it is easy to whisk away years of hard-earned wealth (vehicles, smartphones, etc) in a day from its rightful owners, what is the incentive to work hard?

Given such an environment, why do we bemoan 'Dubai Leaks'? Would you like to keep your wealth here? Sure, those who earn wealth in a dubious manner do send it to safer havens, but crying hoarse over corruption cannot take away from the fact that citizens have little to no confidence in a state's ability to safeguard their legitimately earned wealth, which results in its flow to other places.

Even better, ask yourself why Pakistan's best brains have been fleeing the country for dear

cades now. Gloating needlessly about \$30 billion-plus in 'remittances' does not account for the aggregate loss to our economy due to our diaspora's contributions elsewhere.

Pakistan is a Hobbesian nightmare since what Hobbes feared the most (life being "nasty, brutish and short") is at play in Pakistan. And the government that he envisioned, which was supposed to act as a bulwark against this possibility, is nowhere to be found.

Let everyone be very clear: Pakistan's state has a legitimacy problem. Its citizens have lost trust in the ability of the state to provide them with an environment where they can pursue their well-being without any fear. No amount of foreign tours for begging dollars, SIFCs, outlandish financial returns, etc, can convince foreigners when a state's own citizens are so disenchanted and disillusioned. And neither can gimmicks such as sasti roti, public sector freebies, SNC, mega infrastructure projects or government-sponsored cash handouts bring back that confidence.

Tick tock

Almost five months since one of the most manipulated general elections in our checkered history, there is an ominous quiet before yet another impending storm. What form it takes is unknown, but it is clear that the current hybrid regime is devoid of legitimacy and has neither the will nor the capacity to resolve Pakistan's many structural crises.

The PTI is convinced that it is the answer to Pakistan's problems, and can viably claim to being the party with the most popular support across what is an extremely divided polity. But for all of the repression that the PTI has experienced over the past two years, there is little evidence that it would be able to lead a process of structural change to overhaul Pakistan's militarised political economy and state ideology and resolve deeply rooted class, gender and ethnic-national contradictions.

Those political forces that I believe do offer at least the ideological depth and political commitment to challenge the establishment-centric order are not sufficiently strong to do so. In this category are some ethno-nationalist forces — particularly youth-led movements like the PTM and the Baloch long march.

In the core areas of the country, relatively newer and distinct religio-political organisations are also gaining steady ground. The TLP stands out amongst all of them, and has recently been at the forefront of organised lynchings campaigns against Punjabi Christians as well as Ahmadis. Such groups not only do the politics of hate, they also undertake welfare and other societal activities that deepens their social base in the absence of state-led welfare and reconstruction schemes.

It is worth bearing in mind that most of these organisations boast an extremely youthful rank and file, and they will continue to grow so long as the underlying socio-economic decay is not arrested. The way in which the current regime treated farmers amidst the wheat import scandal, unrelenting inflation and unemployment, as well as the disdain for workers' rights and unionisation tell us that the potential pool of support for militant organisations will only grow.

Meanwhile, even higher up the class ladder, relatively educated segments continue to be fed a stylised set of facts in the name of the 'two-nation theory' that inhibit

critical thinking and innovation, while rewarding those who want to become cogs in the state's bureaucratic machine.

It is also well-documented that a huge number of young people are trying to get out of the country by hook or by crook, and this is not limited to those who are dirt poor. In other words, the classic brain drain is also continuing to play out, with no sign of reversal.

All told, the situation is dire, and likely to get worse. I do not mean to spread doom and gloom but it is essential that existing realities are acknowledged so that we stop going around in circles. Interrupting the worsening cycle requires those who have recently experienced repression — here I am referring particularly to the PTI — to look beyond messiahs.

For ethnic-nationalists and the left, who are the only forces immediately committed to taking on the challenge of building a popular politics for social transformation, there must be a willingness to find allies within the mainstream that can be coaxed into deepening their political positions.

None of this will happen through wishful thinking. It requires conscious recognition of the situation we face and viable strategies to redress it. The clock is ticking and the urgency of our myriad predicaments increasing, and here I have not even considered the growing likelihood of climate breakdown events. It is under this backdrop that hateful ideologies and molecular violence are deepening across the social formation.

Appealing to the good sense of the powerful does us no good. The oppressed must come together to take things into their own hands. -- Courtesy Dawn

Lawmakers urge govt to provide more relief to agriculture, IT sectors

ISLAMABAD (APP): Lawmakers in the National Assembly on Friday urged the government to focus on people-oriented policies and provide more relief to the agriculture and Information Technology sectors.

Muttahida Qaumi Movement (Pakistan) leader Muhammad Farooq Sattar, while participating in the budget debate, termed the budget for 2024-25 as traditional, reflecting a continuity of policies from the past 77 years.

"The country's current debt servicing issues, noting that most budget allocations are used for this purpose," he highlighted.

He said, "It is the government's responsibility to prepare the budget with the public's issues in

mind."

He said, "Unfortunately, every budget seems to favor the wealthy."

Sattar urged the government to focus on the agriculture sector and criticized the imposition of more taxes on salaried individuals.

He called for relief measures for the poor in the budget and asked the government to revise the National Finance Commission (NFC) Award.

He stressed the need to resolve Karachi's water issues and to allocate more funds to improve the city's drain system.

He also advocated for more incentives to attract Foreign Direct Investment and for policies that encourage a growth-oriented economy.

Investment of approx. \$50m Engro fertilizers completes largest-ever EnVen plant turnaround

ISLAMABAD (APP): Engro Fertilizers has invested approximately USD 50 million in a plant turnaround to enhance its reliability and operational efficiency and the company successfully completed the largest-ever scheduled maintenance activity for the EnVen Plant, spanning 55 days, as planned on June 18, 2024. Established in 2011 with an investment of USD 1.1 billion, the EnVen Plant has an annual production capacity of 1.3 million tons and is the most energy efficient fertilizer plant in Pakistan, with the lowest consumption of gas per ton of urea, said a news release.

The project scope of the turnaround included over 5,000 technical activities, including the first-ever replacement of the waste heat boiler, overhaul of the furnace convection section, ammonia storage tank inspection and a comprehensive overhaul of six major turbo trains and gas turbines.

At peak, more than 6,000 people were engaged round-the-clock at the plant site for these turnaround activities.

Funds managed by Actis hold a majority interest in Solis, which is a major shareholder in Yellow Door. Yellow Door is actively engaged in the solar electricity business in


