According to the Inter Services Public Relations (ISPR) news release on Tuesday, in early hours of July 15th, a group of ten terrorists attacked Bannu Cantonment, whereas the attempt to enter the cantonment was effectively thwarted by the security forces personnel, which forced the terrorists to ram an explosive laden vehicle into perimeter wall of the cantonment.

The suicide blast led to collapse of portion of the wall and damaged the adjoining infrastructure, resulting in shahadat of eight brave sons of soil that included Naib Subedar Muhammad Shehzad (age: 44 years, resident of: District Poonch, AJK), Havildar Zil-e-Hussain (age: 39 years, resident of: District Khushab), Havildar Shahzad Ahmed (age: 28 years, resident of: District Neelum, AJK), Sepoy Ashfaq Hussain Khan (age: 30 years, resi-District Muzzafarabad, AJK), Sepoy Sobhan Majeed

US expresses concern over Pak govt's decision to seek ban on PTI

WASHINGTON (INP): The United States has expressed concern over the Pakistan government's decision to seek a ban on the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) for anti-State activi-

Speaking at his daily news briefing in Washington, US State Department Spokesperson Matthew Miller responded to questions regarding the "possible restrictions on PTI".


Miller stated that the JS has observed government statements imposing restrictions on political parties, which raises concerns that such actions could mark the beginning of a political crackdown. He said that the US will closely monitor these internal developments and decisions.

Miller added that any estrictions on political parties are worrisome because they contradict human rights, freedom of expression, constitutional, and democratic principles.

He emphasised that the United States has always supported actions promoting justice, including adherence to democratic practices and broader principles and laws. Miller further said the Pakistani

government's decision to ban the PTI was a complex political process but added that it would be concerned if a political party were banned. "Our understanding is this is the beginning of what would be a complete complex political process. but certainly banning of a political party is something that would be a great concern to us," he added.

Banning PTI

It is dangerous for a government to appear so desperate. Like grains of sand, power slips quicker from the hand the tighter the fist is clenched. In their obsession with countering the resurgent PTI, the ruling parties are, wittingly or unwittingly pushing the country towards even more chaos and anarchy instead of accepting ground realities and working around them.

Though 11 judges of the Supreme Court, including the chief justice, only last week recognised the PTI's bona fides as a political party, the coalition government is now seeking a complete ban on the party itself.

The shock proclamation came on Monday afternoon, along with announcements that the government had decided to seek a review of the Supreme Court's ruling in the reserved seats case as well as proceedings under Article 6 against former president Arif Alvi, former prime minister Imran Khan, and former deputy speaker of the National Assembly, Qasim Suri.

Was this the government's best response to losing its two-thirds majority, which, in any case, had only been secured thanks to a series of unconstitutional and unlawful decisions taken by the Election Commission? Was the prospect of the largest party in parliament being restored to its rightful status so alarming that the ruling parties, in the tradition of military dictators, would seek to ban it on dubious charges?

If the government thought it was projecting power through Information Minister Atta Tarar's Monday press conference, it was gravely mistaken. It only managed to appear desperate and intimidated, clutching at straws while the tide rises around it. One can only hope that it was merely testing the waters for what the reaction may be to such a move. Nevertheless, it was a shock that the stalwarts in its ranks had not shot down the proposal before a minister went public with it.

It appears that the government and its backers within the establishment have still not realised that they are in uncharted territory. Previous regimes that ruled through political coercion and fear tactics had strong economies backing them. The conditions right now appear to be far from conducive for the type of brinkmanship and adventurism being displayed by the current regime. If the idea is to precipitate a collapse of the democratic political order, then, by all means, the authorities should

However, if social and economic stability is what is sought, they would be well-advised to undertake a hard course correction. At the same time, the PTI also needs to display some flexibility and greater maturity. It appears that it has gained enough leverage to be able to achieve its political objectives without the country having to travel further down the path of political violence and social instability. Victory in politics is rarely absolute. It must open itself to negotiations.

The report revealed that while the upper sections of the gates were in stable condition, the lower sections of most of the gates had been severely Fourteen corroded. gates showed a reduction in thickness in the lower portion. The reduction was estimated to be less than 10 per cent in the vertical girder flanges, the web plates and main skin plates of these gates. On the other hand, seven gates showed a reduction in thickness of below 20pc. The report recommended either repairing the lower sections of the gates or replacing them along with girders. Subsequently six gates were replaced.

A technical investigation into the damage done to Gate 39 in 2018 and the rupture of a gate in 1982 provides suffi-cient evidence of structural fatigue.

For instance, there is the Payment of Wages Act, 1936, and three Rules of 1937, 1938 and 1960. Then there are the Minimum Wages Ordinance, 1961, the Rules of 1962 and the West Pakistan Minimum Wages for Unskilled Workers Ordinance, 1969.

Labour laws should be simple, especially for those ensuring compliance with statutory requirements. PESHAWAR (APP): In the heart of South Asia lies Peshawar, a city with stories spanning over past 2,500 years and an inimitable destination of domestic and foreign artisans bringing in marvelous and

Rich in different traditional and cultural values this city boast of a tapestry of different dynasties and civilizations, most vibrant among them the handicrafts introduced by local and foreign artisans of pre-Greek, Mughals and

colonial era.

eye-catching crafts designs.

Aptly named as "Pesha War" or "the City of Artisans," Peshawar still carries the legacy of craftsmanship passed down generation after generation with city bazaars like Misgran, Ratti bazaar, Dabgari Gardens and the legendary Qissa Khawani Bazaar, still echoing past glory of arti-

"Walking through these markets is like stepping back in time. The air is filled with metal clinking, the scent of wood and steel shavings and curving and sight of meticulously crafted items," said a Senior Research Officer, Archeology and Museums Depart-Khyber ment Pakhtunkhwa, Bakhtzada Khan.

"The shops brimming with wood and metal cutlery capture the attention of visitors as despite rapid technological advancements, these ancient bazaars maintain a steadfast appeal, especially among rural people of KP and Punjab provinces," he

stated

Bakhtzada said the discovery of human remains in Soan Valley in Punjab was evidence of stone-made cutlery and bone tools used anciently. "It was found that people started making clay and stone pots, crockery and other related utensils during the Neolithic period commonly known as new Stone Age dating back some 8,000 years back.

The wooden cutlery shops in Peshawar bazaars, in particular, are a visual feast, displaying an array of handmade items—wooden spoons, blenders, kneading plates, curd mixers and bowls—showcasing artisans' dedication and hard work. These products, though presenting an old-fashioned look, also posunique designs. 'Wooden cutlery is

still alive in Peshawar. We have valuable customers for whom we specially produce these items," said Qaiser Khan, a shopkeeper in main Dabgari Bazaar. "Majority of our customers belong to KPK and Punjab while our cutlery is also preferred in Afghanistan, Middle East and Central Asians Republics due to its durability and unique designs." However, he complained of the lukewarm response of urban population who consider these products as obsolete and outdated and shifted to stainless steel cutlery and porcelain crockery.

Faraz Ali, another shopkeeper at Misgarn bazaar said use of wooden cutlery had declined in re-

cent decades and the KPK government should take steps to preserve this asset. "Wooden utensils are mostly cheaper than stainless steel or aluminum. Moreover, many people think that meals cooked in clay pottery with the help of a wooden spoon are bet-

If seen in the hygiene perspective, the wood cutlery and clay pots are not that harmful as those prepared by using certain chemical components.

"On Monday evening, rain caused by thunder-storms killed 35 people and injured 230 others in Jalalabad and certain districts of Nangarhar" province, Quraishi Badloon, head of the department of information and culture,

The casualties were caused by heavy storms and rains that collapsed trees, walls and roofs of people's houses, Badloon said. "There is a possibility that casualties might rise," he went on, adding that the wounded as well as victims' bodies were brought to Nangarhar regional hospital and Fatimatul-Zahra ĥospital.

Images shared by Badloon's department showed medical personnel

forms giving treatment to the wounded. "We share the grief of the families of the victims," said Zabihullah Mujahid, a spokesman for the Taliban government.

'The relevant institutions of the Islamic Emirate have been directed to go to the affected areas as soon as possible," Mujahid wrote on X, adding they would provide shelter, food and medicine to displaced

The tragedy comes after flash floods killed hundreds of people in Afghanistan in May and swamped agricultural lands in the country, where 80 per cent of the population depends on farming to survive.


