PCB goes back to 'old model' of one-year central contracts, no pay cuts

LAHORE: The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) Monday announced going back to its old model of granting a one-year central contract to the national side's players, conditional to their per-

Among several decisions taken during a meeting of the board's top brass, the officials decided against cutting the salaries of the players, who are under fire after their dismal T20 World Cup 2024.

The monthly salaries of the players and their income were under discussion after the Pakistani side failed to live up to the fans' expectations and crashed out of the tournament before even entering the Super 8 stage.

In a statement, the board said: "The central contract's tenure will be of a year. The players' performance and fitness will be reviewed every year. Inclusion of players in different categories will be made un-der a well-defined process."

The PCB also decided that players' fitness would be checked every three months and that it would be mandatory for the athletes to participate in domestic cricket.

Currently, Category A players, which include

Babar Azam, Mohammad the players would be Rizwan, and star pacer Shaheen Afridi, are paid Rs4.5 million per month. Meanwhile, Shadab ments would be granted the

After 1978, Wenzhou took the lead in exploring a market economy. Thousands of individual household businesses overcame Wenzhou's disadvantages in geographical location and resource scarcity, leading to rapid economic development, a thriving commodity economy and significant improvements in people's standards. Wenzhou's GDP skyrocketed from 1.32 billion yuan (\$182 million) in 1978 to 82.8 billion yuan (\$11.4 billion) in 2000, with an average annual growth rate of 15.6

Afghan challenge

The recently released UN monitoring team's report on Afghanistan captures the dilemma confronting the international community where dealing with the country's Taliban rulers is concerned. On the one hand, the Taliban have managed to stabilise Afghanistan after decades of conflict. But on the other, under the hard-line movement's rule, terrorist groups are flourishing on Afghan soil. A third scenario should also be of concern to foreign states, particularly Afghanistan's neighbours: IS-K — which is opposed to the Taliban — is believed to have between 2,000 to 6,000 fighters, and is using Afghanistan as a base for its external operations. Moreover, the terrorist outfit is also looking to poach fighters from other militant groups.

Though the Taliban regime is by no means a progressive pro-people entity, it has managed to bring a semblance of stability to Afghanistan after over four decades of war. The UN report says that as the Taliban "transition from insurgency to governing authority" they have brought down petty corruption and reduced poppy cultivation, while managing to keep the precarious economy

Voting for change

n what is regarded as the biggest election year in history, with voters in over 70 countries casting the ballot in 2024, some common features have emerged in the polls that have taken place. In countries both in the West and East, the electorate's yearning for change has been evident. So has strong antiincumbency sentiment that has dealt heavy blows to ruling parties. Driving this are fraught economic conditions and the cost-of-living crisis sweeping the world. Discontent in a landscape of economic inequality has motivated voters to punish incumbents. Another common aspect is the anti-establishment vote, with people holding establishment leaders responsible for the unedifying state of af-

fairs in their country. Many countries that have held elections are deeply polarised and whose politics has become increasingly fractured and volatile. The political system is seen not to deliver at a time of heightened public expectations, magnified by the social media. In several cases, electoral mandates have not

matched the popular vote, with the first-past-the-post system disproportionately rewarding the election winner and obscuring underlying political realities. There are, of course, many differences among these countries reflecting their specific circumstances and political trajectories. The desire for change, for example, has led to different outcomes in different countries but the common trends hold even if their political expressions The election in France

several common features described above. Buoyed by its strong showing in the European Parliament elections, Marine Le Pen's far right party swept the first round of the French poll. The incumbent President Emmanuel Macron's party came third in an atmosphere of popular disenchantment. Calling a snap poll seemed to backfire as fears grew of the country's throwback to the time of the Vichy regime when France was ruled by the far right during the Second World War. Those fears galvanised voters who in the run-off election produced an outcome that surprised poll-

in order to secure an easing of the sanctions that have inflicted so much hardship on the Iranian people. He also promised to relax social restrictions imposed by previous hard-line governments, indicating there may be no return to the repressive policies of the past.

While Pezeshkian's electoral victory was owed to enthusiastic voters it was also because he was allowed to run by the political/ religious establishment, which had disqualified reformist candidates in the past and seen its legitimacy erode over the years as the economy deteriorated. Its decision was driven by fear of the return of ultra conservatives represented, among others, by the Paydari, a hard-line political group, whose members are called "super revolutionaries" in Iran. It supported Pezeshkian's rival Saeed Jalili. The group opposes in principle any opening to the West and has hard-line views on other issues. It was rumoured that the Paydari, who backed Jalili, had their own plans on the future leadership, which would have influenced succession engage with the West and to Supreme Leader Ayatol-

lah Ali Khamenei. These power dynamics created an enabling environment for the Iranian electorate to vote for change in the election.

The Indian election also saw anti-incumbency sentiment robbing Narendra Modi's BJP of a majority. Although he was re-elected prime minister, his use of the Hindutva card as well as claims he had delivered a better economic future to India's underprivileged were rejected by voters, as were his high-handed ruling methods. The Congress party-led opposition alliance did much better than pollsters predicted and managed to capitalise on anti-incumbency dissatisfaction, especially with soaring inflation and rising unemployment. Like elections in other countries, voters in economic distress made their disenchantment with the status quo evident by denying the BJP a majority and forcing it to rely on allies to stay in power. The BJP still got 240 seats but with just 36 per cent of the popular vote. The polarisation that India has seen in the past decade looks set to continue.

Elections in Britain saw a stronger anti-incum-

crushing defeat on the Conservative Party, in its worst-ever electoral performance. The Tory party's inept and scandal-ridden 14 years in power convinced voters it was time for a change especially as its economic management at a time of austerity evoked widespread public anger as it left people much worse off. Sweeping cuts in public services also deepened public discontent. Brexit divided the country and to some extent the vote against the Tories also reflected a backlash against a decision many Britons disagreed with. The vote was motivated more by rage at the Tories than enthusiasm for Labour, which also saw its Muslim support dwindle over its Gaza stance. It lost four seats to pro-Palestinian independents. The Conservative Party vote was eroded by the far right represented by Nigel Farage's Reform UK party, which polled 14pc of the popular vote. The Islamabad High Court (IHC) order in the audio leaks case has been challenged by the government in the Supreme Court and an SRO authorising the Inter-Services Intelligence Agency (ISI) to surveil citizens on the vague pretext of national security has been issued by the government. This SRO has already been challenged before the Lahore and Islamabad high courts.

Seemingly, the SRO is a reaction to the IHC's inquiry into the lawfulness surveillance and whether any entity was authorised by law to interanswer was a resounding no, so the government thought the fix to this would be to 'legalise' what was already being done in practice, post facto.

The SRO states: "The federal government in the interest of national

In a way, some dissenting judgements reflect what could have been, and what can one day still be achieved. To quote Benjamin N. Cardozo, the dissenter speaks to the future. Recently, by a majority of 2-1, our Supreme Court converted a conviction of rape into 'fornication'. In a powerful dis-

Before the court, a woman had accused her brother's friend of rape. The trial court and the high court ruled in the woman's favour. At the Supreme Court, Justice Malik Shahzad Ahmad Khan and Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhail found that the woman was a consenting party.

Judges can have genuine disagreements on whether evidentiary standards have been met particularly in a criminal case where the liberty of an individual is involved. dence before the court is cation to be proved, it enough to uphold the conviction. But instead of limiting themselves to the evidence, the majority went on to determine how a rape victim should have

Since the man was unarmed, the majority held, "a female who is not a consenting party would in a case of attempt to commit rape with her" and "no mark of violence whatsoever was noted on the entire body". The court effectively found that an 'actual' rape victim would have offered strong resistance, and there would be resistance marks on her body to establish this. This reasoning shifts the onus onto the victim, ie, she should have done more, she should have resisted, she should have fought back

dissent identifies studies rial. by expert psychiatrists, which show that in cases of sexual violence, victims may have various different types of response fight, flight or freeze. There is no fixed response in rape cases. To say that a woman must 'fight' looks at rape from a masculine lens, and undermines a woman's lived experience. Per Justice Malik, "the offence of rape is made on the body of the victim and her response to this offensive cannot

standardised" The New York Times magazine did a story, speaking to rape victims about the 'freezing' response. Some victims said they wanted to yell and push and resist, but their body simply would not respond. Others blanked out or were too shocked to react, and went into a state of involuntary paralysis. The majority assumes one type of response, the only type they are able to imag-

Moreover, for fornimust be shown that sexual intercourse was consensual. The majority has imputed consent on behalf of the victim, whereas the dissent found that consent must be an unequivocal voluntary agreement. Consent must not be as-

The majority judgement then holds that there was a two-day delay in filing an FIR. This finding ignores precedent which clearly states that in cases of sexual assault, a lenient view should be taken on delayed reporting. In line with established precedent, Justice Malik writes: "With reference to delay, this Court has held that delay is of no consequence as such cases involve the victim and her family's reputation and honour, hence, some delay in reporting a crime of

majority has a striking similarity with the Mukhtaran Mai case. In both cases, the court completely disregards the extreme trauma associated with rape, and how this may result in slower reporting. In Mukhtaran Mai's memoir, she expresses how she felt suicidal after the incident: " have made up my mind. I want to kill myself ... I'm already dead in the eyes of others." It takes time and strength to undertake a le--gal battle, to use this against a victim is an in--justice that ign-ores the cultural and social

The majority seem to have come up with a rulebook on how victims should react in order to get justice. The 'right' victim fights, the 'right' victim has marks of resistance, the 'right' victim reports immediately.

A few weeks ago, Justice Malik was speaking at a symposium on inclusive justice organised by the Federal Judicial Academy and UN Women. She explained that her reasoning may differ from her male colleagues: "my understanding may be very different because it's based on a different premise, because it's based on my life experiences, it's based on my perspective which is the gender perspective."

The tragic reality in Pakistan is, since men dominate the judiciary, our jurisprudence is dictated by the male lived experience. There is little to no gender sensitisation training in the judicial system, and gender stereotypes remain deeply embedded. The voice, perspective, and lived experience of nearly half the population continues to be overlooked. -- Cour-

In most developed societies, the vision for growth has come from humanities education — philosophy, literature and culture. Sadly, we've deprioritised humanities. We have also failed to retain our doctors and scientists, and we haven't upgraded our math, engineering and technology teaching. What we are looking at is an economy teetering on the brink of decline and we need quick solutions for uplift.

Pakistan Vision 2025 by the planning ministry highlights some key areas demanding urgent focus. Among these is the need to create jobs. Unfortunately, while it highlights the pillars for improvement and change, it doesn't lay out the strategy that will address the urgent need for employ-Employment path-

ways such as establishing recruitment programmes that are backed by agencies serving particular geographical communities may provide quick and easy access to match graduates with available jobs in their area. Tax breaks for companies that hire a set quota of fresh graduates may create the impetus to hire and train for the skills needed for the jobs. Employed people spend more, pay taxes and boost the economy through generating money. Smaller companies can benefit from hiring graduates who have lower salary expectations and can be trained quickly.

Very few universities offer placement centres to help graduates find jobs, and fewer still have experimented with incubation centres to set up entrepreneurship opportunities for their students. This is mainly due to the costs attached. However, the long-term benefits outweigh the costs. Supporting entrepreneurship

by funding small and promising ventures may enable universities to create economic opportunities for their graduates, whilst earning themselves a sound reputation that will help attract and retain students, creating new revenue streams for the institution.

There is much to learn from developed societies. One study of the US economy from 1980 to 2005 found that the annual net employment gro-w-th in the US would have been negative small wi--thout busin-esses. The cumulative effect of small businesses on job creation is massive, especial--ly given that they tend to keep costs low by hiring fresh graduates on relatively lower sa---laries.

It also creates a pathway for development as the small businesses become training grounds for the young population who can then transition to the larger companies in due course In fact, this isn't new to us. After independence, Quaid-i-Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah initiated a policy of funding small businesses and giving concessions to spur economic growth in key sectors. Jinnah made it clear that industrial power was Pakistan's hope to reduce dependence on external help for life's necessities

Traditionally, developed societies have also created programmes that match small entrepreneurs with the more successful and established ones to create networking synergies within commu-



2 workers die while cleaning sewerage



Gaza civil defence says 15 killed in Israel strike on Gaza school

GAZA STRIP: The civil defence agency in Hamasrun Gaza said Sunday that 15 people were killed in a strike on a school sheltering war displaced where the Israeli military said it had targeted "terrorists".

The strike on the UNrun Abu Araban site in central Gaza's Nuseirat camp was the fifth on a schoolturned-shelter in eight days. The Abu Araban school was housing "thousands of displaced people," civil defence agency spokesman Mahmud Bassal told AFP, adding

women and children. Schools in Nuseirat were the target for two of the earlier school strikes as Israel keeps up its offensive against Hamas Palestinian militants who triggered the war with their October 7 attack on Israel.

Israel says Hamas uses schools, hospitals and other public infrastructure for military purposes. Hamas denies the accusation. France and Germany on Wednesday called for an investigation into the school strikes.

Monitoring Desk ROME: Italy's tax police said Saturday they had freed 33 Indian farm workers from "slave-like working conditions" in the northern province of Verona, while seizing almost half a million euros from the two alleged gangmasters. Police said the two alleged abusers, also Indian, persuaded their fellow nationals to come to Italy, paying €17,000 each to obtain seasonal working

permits. The men were

then obliged to work in

farms for seven days a week and up to 10-12 hours a day, paid only 4 euros per hour, in conditions that the Italian police described as "slavery." Some of the migrants were also asked to continue working for free to pay an additional 13,000 euros for a permanent work permit, which in reality they would have never obtained, the police added.

The two alleged abusers are under investigation for crimes including enslavement and labor exploitation.

Belarus's Lukashenko says border tension gone, extra troops go home

BELARUS: Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko, a close ally of Kremlin leader Vladimir Putin, said that tensions had subsided at his country's border with Ukraine and extra troops deployed there were being sent back to their bases.

"That means that those (Ukrainian) troops which had been brought in as reinforcements are now gone," BelTA quoted him as saying. "... There are now no difficulties with the Ukrainians and I hope there will

BelTA said he told a meeting of regional officials that the additional Belarusian troops dispatched to the area should return to their assigned bases. "Well, friends, we have to pull back our troops from the border," he was quoted as saying. Rescuers in Nepal recover 11 bodies after a landslide swept 2 buses full of people into a river

Monday. Rescuers found the bodies in different spots along the riverbanks as they searched for the missing buses and some 50 people who were on board.

Government administrator Khima Nanda Bhusal said seven bodies were iden-

tified and relatives contacted. Three of the dead are Indians and the remaining four are Nepali nation-

He said four more bodies were also recovered from the river, but because they haven't been identified, it was unclear if they had been on board the buses.

"We will continue the search as long as it is needed and have no plans to give up. We will work until all of them are found," he said.
