ISLAMABAD (APP): Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Thursday said that the coalition government and the national institutions were in an unprecedented harmony and cooperation to serve the better national interests and steer the country out of prevailing challenges.

NEPRA notifies Rs 2.56 per unit increase in FCA for June

ISLAMABAD (APP): National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) on Thursday notified Rs 2.56 per unit increase in power tariff under monthly fuel cost adjustment mechanism for the month of June. In the petition, the Central Power Purchasing Agency (CPA-G) on behalf of XWDISCOs had sought Rs 2.63 per unit increase in power tariff for June.

The CPA-G maintained in its petition that the actual cost of electricity remained Rs 9.70 per unit against reference fuel charges of Rs 7.14 per unit for the said period. The increase would be applicable to all the consumer categories except Electric Vehicle Charging Stations (EVCS) and life-line consumers. It would be shown separately in the consumers' bills on the basis of units billed to the consumers in the month of June 2024.

Govt to scrap 1990s IPP contracts in major relief move

ISLAMABAD (INP): The government has decided to terminate the power purchase agreements (PPAs) with Independent Power Producers (IPPs) made in the 1990s, aiming to provide significant relief to consumers suffering from high electricity costs.

work is being developed for consumers using more than 201 units, with changes to the policy that currently maintains them in the same slab for six months. Special slabs are being considered for these high-usage consumers, with a potential rate of Rs. 26 per unit for those exceeding 201 units.

According to media reports, the federal government, under the leadership of Energy Minister Owais Leghari, has finalized a framework for this major policy shift. An official announcement is expected soon. In addition to terminating old IPP contracts, the government is reviewing agreements with other IPP companies. A new frame-

RAWALPINDI (INP): Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan has asserted that the government has just two months left, dismissing claims that he has apologized.

Temporary relief

The government must have heaved a sigh of relief on securing commitments from allies China, Saudi Arabia and the UAE to roll over Pakistan's bilateral debt of \$12bn for yet another year.

This rekindles hopes of approval of the new \$7bn IMF bailout, crucial to shore up Pakistan's official international reserves and meet its foreign financing needs, by the lender's executive board later this month. These loans come up for a rollover at different times every year because we are unable to repay them due to a liquidity crunch. That these countries have apparently declined, or deferred, Pakistan's request to extend the maturity period of the loans to three to five years to provide greater predictability over the tenure of the IMF programme shows that even friendly nations are hesitant to bet on us over the long term.

Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb, who broke the news on Tuesday, noted that our projected financial needs stood at around \$3-5bn for the next three years, and that these funds could be managed comfortably. According to him, the government had received offers from foreign commercial banks for concessional loans and had hired a Chinese adviser to launch the Panda bond to initially raise \$300m amid efforts to reprofile the Chinese energy debt of \$15bn for a longer period to ease pressure on the fragile external account.

Indeed, Pakistan's economy, which is characterised by a shrinking GDP, a balance-of-payments crisis and high inflation, has 'stabilised' in recent months thanks to the emergency loan of \$3bn from the Fund. However, its short- to medium-term outlook remains uncertain. The country needs nearly \$25bn annually to finance its large trade deficit and repay its foreign debt, while it has around \$9bn in its reserves.

The new IMF programme is expected to help consolidate this newfound stability but the quest for faster and sustainable economic growth will remain elusive for years even if we move in the right direction. Most of us, including the policymakers, believe that compliance with the IMF's tough conditions and its successful reviews constitute the much-needed structural reforms.

This, however, is misleading. Our deep-seated problems need tough and politically unpopular reforms beyond just securing a new bailout from the lender of last resort; the IMF loan will provide only temporary relief. The IMF is here to simply ensure that the country carries out its external financial commitments, because boosting economic growth or reforms in a client economy does not constitute the Fund's mandate as such. Some 20 years ago, Pakistan's economy was 18pc the size of India's; now that figure is only 9pc. This is in spite of five bailouts from the IMF during that period. This means we must look beyond the temporary support of bailouts to overcome our crisis.

Heart drops

Readers and Leonardo da Vinci are owed an apology. The tableau at the opening ceremony of the Paris Olympics that caused such offence was not a pastiche of Leonardo's iconic mural Last Supper.

The organisers have clarified that the tableau depicted a bacchanalian scene showing an assembly of Greek gods, led by Dionysus, the god of wine. The inspiration came from a painting — The Feast of the Gods — by the 17th-century Dutch artist Jan Harmensz van Bijlert.

Was there no symbol closer to France's reputation as the capital of wine than Greek gods and a Dutch painter?

Whatever other lessons the French have learned from the 2024 Olympics, one is that too many cooks can spoil a bouillon, even in France. The other, never to take decisions by committee, for didn't a wit warn that 'a camel is a horse designed by a committee'.

The Olympic events, spread over the last week in different venues, have confirmed France's administrative talents. The stunning gardens of Versailles palace could not have been a nobler backdrop for the riding competitions, a fusion of equestrian elegance and ineffable taste.

The 2024 Olympics will be remembered, though, for unexpected issues that emerged.

Gender, for one. For millennia, men and women were classed as opposites, compatible but uniquely separate. Being a hermaphrodite (the word comes from the fusion of the Greek deities Hermes and Aphrodite) put one in a no-man's or no-woman's land.

Parisians have for long tolerated the nightly infestation of its Bois de Boulogne gardens by provocative professionals from Brazil. The Olymp-

pic organisers had no problem with gay divers like Greg Louganis (gold medalist, Los Angeles, 1984, Seoul, 1988) or Tom Daley (gold, Tokyo 2020), even when Daley spent his off-platform time knitting for his partner.

Two boxers — Imane Khelif of Algeria and Lin Yu-ting of Taiwan — were slammed by critics for competing as women, even though they had failed gender eligibility tests sometime in the past.

Will the IOC be forced to create a new category for trans people? They have already provided for national ambiguity by allowing refugees to compete as displaced nationals, and athletes from Russian and Belarussian to be admitted as Individual Neutral Athletes.

For some competitors, the use of technology has proved a bane. Photo-finishes are a tool of the past. Now, even turns in a swimming relay are scrutinised with shark-eyed precision. In the women's 200-metre individual swimming medley, Alex Walsh finished the backstroke and was going into the breaststroke. That millisecond turn was deemed illegal and Walsh (who would otherwise have won a bronze medal) forfeited her prize.

Similarly, the British medalist Luke Greenbank thought he had qualified in the 200m back-stroke heat for the semifinals. To his grief, he was disqualified because he was "completely underwater past the red 15-metre mark following a turn". They were no grounds for review. Replays could not be refused. Understandably, he felt "absolutely gutted".

For every Olympic medal winner — whether gold, silver or bronze — there are hundreds of disappointed athletes who have spent years preparing for the event. As one athlete put it: "We have ups and

downs. Unfortunately, you can't pick the days they come on."

If one has to admit partiality in favour of any single contestant, it would have to be for the Serbian tennis ace Novak Djokovic.

Djokovic has won an all-time record of 24 Grand Slam titles. He achieved a triple Grand Slam by winning each of the four majors at least three times. "Djokovic is also the only man in tennis history to be the reigning champion of all four majors at once across three different surfaces."

In the recent Wimbledon men's final last month, a 37-year-old Djokovic lost to the 21-year-old Carlos Alcaraz. Djokovic had reached the age when men look forward to playing with un-born grandchildren. Critics wrote him off. But Djokovic craved an Olympic gold as the glittering capstone to a pyramid of hard, unrelenting endeavour.

On Sunday, the sun and the Serbian saints shone on Djokovic. In a tense duel, he secured his victory. Djokovic wept in defeat. Alcaraz wept in defeat. Neither need feel shame: 'Les larmes sont les gouttes du coeur' — tears are the drops of the heart.

By the time of future Olympics (Los Angeles, 2028, and Brisbane, 2032) the world will welcome a fresh crop of competitors. An increasing number will be black, representing traditionally white nations. The IOC should dispense with nationality and gender, and instead honour individuals.

We should applaud those who, despite a lifetime of commitment, never gained a medal, for many of them will no longer be athletes. They will have only memories of having been one. -- Courtesy Dawn

The voiceless

Whenever one reads news items, attributed to a 'source', about the IMF's recommendations to further tax salaried individuals, one always wonders why the Fund never singles out the tax exemptions given to military organisations like the FWO and NLC, or property tax exemptions given to residents of DHAs. One asks why the IMF is hell-bent on taxing salaried individuals, to the extent of pushing them into a state of chronic depression.

I got the answer to this question in a recent casual meeting with an official from the Fund itself. As per this source, the IMF never asks for the salaried class to be taxed; it only asks that tax revenues be increased. Connecting the dots leads one to the realisation that such news items are intentionally fed by the Government of Pakistan to shift the blame on the IMF for the weaknesses inherent in our system. The government lacks the power to tax the powerful sectors, and it all comes down to les misérables — the voiceless salaried class.

When, at a recent press conference, the finance minister was asked the reason for this, he replied that there was no magic wand and that nothing would change overnight. He said we would keep going back to square one unless the untaxed and undertaxed sectors of the economy were brought in the tax net.

This really sums up the fate of the nameless, faceless, voiceless salaried class for many years to come. It would take only one notification to tax the FWO; it would take only one notification to remove the

exemption of tax on 500 square-yard houses in DHA, it would take only one day to make the pension expenses of military personnel a part of the defence budget. But the problem is that a lot would be done overnight if the finance minister adopted this course.

Though I agree with the finance minister that salaried individuals are the easiest route to raising taxes, can he elaborate on any incentive, including amnesty schemes enjoyed by others, given to salaried individuals over the last couple of decades? Is there a scheme by the Government of Pakistan that gives individuals who cross a certain threshold in the amount of income tax deducted from their salary, privileges like getting preferential treatment at CMHes (they are the only reasonable hospitals in the public sector) or admission fee discounts for their children in public sector universities? The finance minister wants salaried individuals to make this sacrifice for the sake of the IMF deal but is not ready to introduce even a single small incentive for these individuals.

The middle and upper middle class, which is comprised mostly of salaried individuals in Pakistan, is the most unfortunate social class in the country. The poor have already given up on any ambition; this class, however, has ambitions and awareness as well. They know a lot and have too little. They are being decimated by government policies and don't have any mechanism through which to fight back.

You may add value to your individual skills to earn a better living but the government has

the final say in your earnings. It is better to be robbed by highway robbers, because at least you can complain about it and it is considered a crime by any court of law. Without getting into too many numbers, let's try to answer a very simple question: has the standard of living of a person earning Rs5 million per annum improved in the last five years, or has it deteriorated drastically? The answer is a no-brainer; the said individual is finding it tougher and tougher to make ends meet because he has to afford a certain lifestyle.

Also, it is pertinent to point out that the riches of an individual working in the private corporate sector or finance sector — like our finance minister, who was president and CEO at a bank until a few months ago — is not the result of government incentives or favours by powerful quarters but his own hard work and many sacrifices by his family in terms of time. The government unabashedly robs a sizable chunk of his earnings and does not provide any incentive whatsoever — not even access to a social media platform like X. Maybe, even unblocking X.com cannot be done overnight?

Lastly, a few weeks ago, the Salaried Class Alliance of Pakistan requested the Supreme Court's intervention in this unfair taxation through a suo motu notice. Truth be told, if your last resort is the Supreme Court in this country, then it is already a lost cause. Salaried individuals in Pakistan are indeed an apt representation of the following line of Victor Hugo's

KP assembly approves salary increase for police personnel

During the session, some resolutions were presented without prior notice, leading to objections from government members who argued that such practices hinder informed decision-making. Speaker Babar Saleem Swati said that resolutions lacking advance notice might not be included in the proceedings unless deemed urgent after consulting the relevant minister.

18 killed, 1,323 injured in 1,189 RTCs in Punjab

LAHORE (APP): At least 18 persons were killed and 1,323 injured in 1,189 Road Traffic Crashes (RTCs) in all 37 districts of Punjab during the last 24 hours.

Out of these, 579 people with serious injuries were shifted to different hospitals, while 744 victims with minor injuries were treated at the incident site by Rescue Medical Teams thus reducing the burden of hospitals. Furthermore, the analysis showed that 707 drivers, 43 underage drivers, 160 pedestrians, and 474 passengers were among the victims of road traffic crashes.

Haniyeh's killing risks 'wider' Middle East conflict, OIC warns

JEDDAH: The heinous killing of Hamas political leader Ismail Haniyeh risks tipping the Middle East into "wider conflict", the chair of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) told a meeting on Wednesday. The comments from Gambian Foreign Minister Mamadou Tangara came as a senior Iranian official said during the meeting that the Islamic republic would need to defend itself from Israel, which it blames for Haniyeh's death last week in Tehran. Iranian and Palestinian officials called for Wednesday's gathering of the 57-member OIC in the Saudi coastal city of Jeddah, saying the body needed to respond to the killing of the Hamas leader.

"This heinous act serves only to escalate the existing tensions potentially leading to a wider conflict that could involve the entire region," said Tangara,

whose country currently chairs the OIC. Haniyeh's killing "will not quell the Palestinian cause but rather it amplifies it, underscoring the urgency for justice and human rights for the Palestinian people", he said. "The sovereignty and territorial integrity of nation states are fundamental principles underpinning the international order."

"Respecting these principles has profound implications and their violation equally carries significant consequences."

Israel has not commented on Haniyeh's death, which Iran has vowed to avenge.

"Currently, in the absence of any appropriate action by the (UN) Security Council against the aggressions and violations of the Israeli regime, the Islamic Republic of Iran has no choice but to use its inherent right to legitimate

Bangladesh Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus takes charge of caretaker govt

DHAKA: Bangladesh's Nobel Peace Prize-winning economist Muhammad Yunus was sworn in as the head of the country's caretaker government on Thursday, three days after former prime minister Sheikh Hasina was forced to quit and flee the country following violent protests.

"I will uphold, support and protect the constitution," Yunus said during the swearing-in ceremony, adding that he would perform his duties "sincerely". Yunus, 84, was recommended for the role by student protesters and returned to Dhaka earlier today from Paris, where he was undergoing medical treatment. "The country has the possibility of becoming a very beautiful nation," an emotional Yunus told reporters at the Dhaka airport, where he was greeted by top military officers and student leaders.

Saudi king allows cabinet to meet without him or crown prince

DUBAI: Saudi Arabia's King Salman issued a royal decree that allows the cabinet to convene in the absence of both himself and the prime minister, his son Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, state media reported on Thursday.

The 88-year-old king of the world's biggest oil exporter, and a major US ally in the Middle East, received medical care for lung inflammation in May that prompted Prince Mohammed to later postpone an official visit to Japan due to the king's health.

US leaders call for calm in the Middle East, even as more American forces head to the region

WASHINGTON: Calling for calm in the Middle East, top U.S. national security leaders said Tuesday that they and allies are directly pressing Israel, Iran and others to avoid escalating the conflict, even as the U.S. moved more troops to the region and threatened retaliation if American forces are attacked.

"It's urgent that everyone in the region take stock of the situation, understand the risk of miscalculation, and make decisions that will calm tensions, not exacerbate them," Secretary of State Antony Blinken

said at the close of a meeting with Australian leaders.

At the same time, Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin noted the attack Monday on U.S. forces in Iraq by an Iranian-backed militia group, which injured seven personnel, and made it clear that the U.S. won't hesitate to respond. "Make no mistake, the United States will not tolerate attacks on our personnel in the region," Austin told reporters at a press conference after the meeting. "And we remain ready to deploy on short notice to meet the evolving threats to our security, our partners or our interests."

Israel kills 40 Palestinians in Gaza airstrikes amid fears of wider war

CAIRO: Israeli forces stepped up airstrikes across the Gaza Strip on Thursday, killing at least 40 people, Palestinian medics said, in further battle with Hamas-led militants as Israel braced for potential wider war in the region.

Israeli airstrikes hit a cluster of houses in central Gaza's Al-Bureij camp, killing at least 15 people, and the nearby Al-Nuseirat camp, killed four, medics said. Nuseirat and Bureij are among the densely populated enclaves' eight historic camps and seen by Israel as strongholds of armed militants. Israeli aircraft also bombed a house in the heart of Gaza City in the north, killing five Palestinians, while another airstrike in the southern city of Khan Younis killed one person and wounded others, according to medics.

Later on Thursday, 15

Palestinians were killed and 30 injured in Israeli bombings of two schools east of Gaza City, the territory's Civil Emergency Service said in a statement.

The Israeli military said it struck Hamas command and control centres embedded in the Abdel-Fattah Hamouda and Al-Zahra schools in the Tuffah neighbourhood of Gaza City, where Hamas militants were operating. It accused Hamas of exploiting civilians and civilian properties for military purposes, an allegation Hamas denies.

Footage circulated on social media, which Reuters could not immediately verify, showed casualties being brought to a hospital on donkey carts. The armed wings of Hamas and Islamic Jihad said they were firing anti-tank rockets and mortar bombs at Israeli forces operating across Gaza.

Russia says fighting continues in Ukrainian incursion into Kursk region

KYIV: Russian troops are fighting Ukrainian forces in the Kursk region in the third day of one of the largest cross-border incursions of the war, the Russian Defense Ministry said Thursday. A ministry statement said the Russian military and border guards have blocked Ukrainian forces from advancing deeper into Kursk region in southwest Russia and that the army is attacking Ukrainian combatants who are trying to advance on the area from Ukraine's Sumy region.

"Attempts by individual units to break through deep into the territory in the Kursk direction are being suppressed," the ministry said. The Institute for the Study of War, a Washington-based think tank, said that as of Wednesday, Ukrainian troops had advanced as much as 10 kilometers (6 miles) into Rus-

sian territory, but that information wasn't confirmed. Ukrainian officials haven't commented on the scope of the operation around the town of Sudzha.

"The enemy has not advanced a single meter, on the contrary, it is retreating. The enemy's equipment and combat forces are being actively destroyed. We hope that in the near future... the enemy will be stopped," the Kursk region's acting deputy governor Andrei Belostotsky said Thursday, according to state news agency RIA-Novosti. Russian President Vladimir Putin on Wednesday described the incursion as a "large-scale provocation." Putin met with his top defense and security officials to discuss what he called the "indiscriminate shelling of civilian buildings, residential houses, ambulances with different types of weapons."

Turkey formally asks to join the genocide case against Israel at the UN court

ANKARA: Turkey on Wednesday filed a request with a U.N. court to join South Africa's lawsuit accusing Israel of genocide in Gaza, the foreign minister said. Turkey's ambassador to the Netherlands, accompanied by a group of Turkish legislators, submitted a declaration of intervention to the International Court of Justice in The Hague.

With the development, Turkey, one of the fiercest critics of Israel's actions in Gaza, becomes the latest nation seeking to participate in the case. Spain, Mexico, Colombia, Nicaragua and Libya have also asked to join the case, as have Palestinian officials. The court's decision on their requests is still pending.

Large 7.1 earthquake recorded off Japan: USGS

TOKYO: A 7.1 magnitude tremor struck off southern Japan on Thursday, the United States Geological Survey (USGS) said, with the local meteorological agency warning of tsunamis striking coastal areas.

Initially, the USGS erroneously recorded two separate earthquakes, registering two tremors at 6.9 and 7.1 magnitude, respectively.

The USGS acknowledged the error on its website, stating, "This event originally showed as two events in our event list. This error has been fixed. There was one event."

Tsunamis of up to one metre were expected to arrive or have arrived in some coastal areas in Kyushu and Shikoku islands, broadcaster NHK reported.

PDMA on high alert, protecting citizens with round-the-clock monitoring: Director

The FCA for July was Rs 3.33 per unit, it further said. The FCA for August would further reduce to Rs 2.56 per unit in the billing month of August, it said.

CII urges SC to review ruling in Mubarak Sani case

ISLAMABAD (INP): The Council of Islamic Ideology (CII) has expressed concerns over several clauses in the Supreme Court's recent ruling on the Mubarak Sani case, calling on the apex court's judges to review their decision. In a statement issued by the CII on Thursday, the council, under the chairmanship of Dr Muhammad Raghbi Hussain Naemi, highlighted its reservations regarding the Supreme Court's July 24 ruling on the criminal review of the Mubarak Sani case. The council urged the judges to reconsider the verdict.

The CII stated that the decision contains aspects that scholars and the council believe do not align with Islamic teachings. The council announced that a detailed report outlining these concerns will soon be submitted to the Supreme Court, noting that the ruling has caused widespread unease among the public.

"This is a matter of faith and love for the Prophet (PBUH), rather than legal technicalities," the statement read. The council emphasized the need for all segments of society to work together to resolve the issue and expressed hope that the honourable Supreme Court will promptly.
