# No tolerance for parallel courts or armed rebellion, Naqvi warns PTM, its supporters

ISLAMABAD (APP): Federal Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi on Tuesday warned that no one would be allowed judicial system will be allowed under any circumstances, Naqvi on Tuesday warned that no one would be allowed to establish a parallel judicial system in the country, use foul language against state institutions, or take up arms.

Following the ban on the Pashtun Tahafuz Movement (PTM), all formalities will be completed, including the cancellation of identity cards, passports, and the closure of political offices and activities. Anyone who attempts to support or assist PTM will also fall under the same ban. A clear message has been sent to those backing PTM that if they act against the country, the same will be done to them, he said. The minister emphasized that rights and taking up arms cannot go hand in hand.

While addressing a press conference at the Ministry of Interior here Wednesday, Mohsin Naqvi stated that while tribal jirgas (councils) have been held before, led by tribal elders, bringing thousands of people to such gatherings is not considered a jirga but something else entirely. the Fourth Schedule.

He further said that the main reason for the ban on PTM is the party's use of derogatory language against state institutions and the police, as well as inciting division among the nation through ethnic discrimination. While discussing political issues and people's rights is permitted, no one will be allowed to incite people against the institutions. Naqvi mentioned that it has come to their attention that individuals from one or two political parties, when meeting with PTM leaders, supported them on the issue of rights but also emphasized that rights cannot be discussed while simultaneously taking up arms.

He added that after the ban on PTM, the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa government had placed 54 individuals and the Balochistan government had placed 34 individuals on

# Soldier embraces martyrdom, two terrorists killed thwarting terrorist attack in Zhob

#### Cabinet committee okays independent multiplayer market for power sector ISLAMABAD (APP): according to a PM Office

The Cabinet Committee on Energy on Wednesday approved the establishment of an independent multiplayer market for power generation and purchase to pave the way for a competitive environment and gradually end the government's role as a sole purchaser of elec-

The committee, in its meeting chaired by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, principally approved the formation of an Independent System and Market Operator (ISMO) which will be later endorsed by the federal cabinet and registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan under the Companies Act 2017,

The ISMO is aimed at gradually doing away with the government's role as a sole buyer of electricity and turning the electricity market into a multiplayer independent, transparent, and competitive market. It will also allow the power consumers to purchase electricity from suppliers other than power distribution

Under the ISMO, longterm planning would be made to produce low-cost electricity and its transmission besides reducing the power prices and circular

The ISMO Board will comprise the experts from the power sector.

# Many things are being done unconstitutionally: CJP

SC seeks opinion from govt, WAPDA on keeping dam funds in private banks

ISLAMABAD (INP): Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa on Wednesday remarked that most of the things in Pakistan were done illegally and unconstitutionally.

He made these remarks during the hearing of Diamir Bhasha and Mohmand Dam Fund case.

A three-member bench, headed by Chief Justice Qazi Faiz Isa, conducted the hearing, where the court was informed that the dam fund currently holds over Rs23 billion, with Rs11 billion as the principal amount and over Rs12 billion in markup.

The Supreme Court of Pakistan has sought actionable suggestions from the Water and Power Develop-Authority (WAPDA), the Auditor General, and the Attorney

General for the proper utilization of the funds in the

Additional attorney general informed the court that the apex court couldn't keep the dam fund amount, adding that the SC registrar was responsible for taking care of the account. He said that no irregularity was reported in the dam fund and markup.

The additional attorney general told the apex court that fund had total Rs23 billion with Rs11 billion as donations and Rs12 billion as markup amount.

The Chief Justice Isa criticized this practice, calling it an "eye-opener," and questioned why the government is essentially benefiting itself.

The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) legal advisor informed the court that the fund's money is managed by the government, and any funds allocated for WAPDA must go through the public account.

## **Palestine MPC**

Pakistan has a long history of showing solidarity with the Palestinian people — at both the state and popular levels — for religious and cultural

The support for the occupied Arab land ranges from Islamist parties to those on the left of the political spectrum. Therefore, it was not unusual to see nearly all main political forces, except the PTI, attend a multiparty conference on Monday, the one-year anniversary of the 'Al Aqsa Flood operation, to highlight the ongoing Israeli atrocities in Gaza. The PTI was reportedly invited to attend the moot, organised by the president and the prime minister, but failed to send its represen-

Among other suggestions, the MPC called for an immediate ceasefire and holding of an emergency OIC summit. Though largely symbolic, the moot at least sent the message that nearly all political forces in Pakistan stand by the oppressed people of Palestine. References to the Israeli aggression in Lebanon were also made, while the MPC upheld Kashmir's right to self-determination.

Of course, there are limits to what Pakistan can do, apart from expressing moral and diplomatic support for the Palestinian people. The state as well as private charities have also sent shipments of aid for the war-ravaged population of Gaza. Yet it must be observed that while the OIC has held several meetings after the Oct 7 events last year, to date the Muslim bloc has failed to adopt a comprehensive policy to help end Israel's genocidal

Simply put, if summitry and noble declarations were enough, Palestine would have been liberated a long time ago. But the Muslim world has failed the people of Gaza, and is now failing the people of Lebanon because there is no will amongst most Muslim ruling elites to take concrete actions to penalise Israel and those financing and supplying Tel Aviv's war machine. The Arab 'oil weapon' deployed in the 1970s, for example, seems like an event from the distant past.

It is also a matter of concern that the PTI did not attend the Palestine MPC. When meetings are held to discuss vital national issues — security, the economy, or in this case, solidarity with an oppressed population — internal political differences should be put aside and a spirit of unity must be displayed.

Indeed, there is acute mistrust between the ruling party and the PTI, but the latter should have joined the other political forces in speaking up for Palestine with one voice. Moreover, such meetings present opportunities where the ice can be broken, and openings can be provided for dialogue. The only democratic way out of the current political impasse is through negotiations — not through nihilistic confrontations. While one opportunity to talk may have been missed, it is hoped both sides clinch the next one, whenever it arises

# American complicity in Gaza

No administration has helped Israel more than I have. None. none. none. remarked US President Joe Biden recently as Israel's genocidal war in Gaza entered its second year, marking a death toll of tens of thousands of Palestinian lives, most of the victims being women and children. The first US president to publicly declare himself a

Zionist', he is not wrong. It may be true that revious US administrations, too, were fully committed to supporting the Zionist state, but the outgoing president went much further in backing Tel Aviv's war crimes in Gaza. The massive military aid provided by America has not only helped the Benjamin Netanyahu government sustain its longest and deadliest war but has also extended the conflict to other regional countries.

One year of devastating air strikes and ground invasions by the Zionist forces has turned the enclave into a death trap, displacing the entire population of Gaza. Meanwhile, hundreds of Palestinians have been killed in Israel's military operation in the occupied West Bank.

A similar horror has not been witnessed in recent history. Support from the US and some other Western countries has given Israel complete impunity. Given the administration's unconditional support for Israel, many observers accuse it of being complicit in what amounts to war crimes. In fact, it has now also become an American war. A record \$17.9 billion has been spent by the Biden administration on military aid to Tel Aviv since the war erupted a year ago, leading to heightened tensions and conflict in the Middle East, according to Brown University's Costs of War project re-

leased this week It is by far the largest military aid sent to Israel in one year. In fact, the report indicates that details of some shipments to Israel are hard to come by. The exact amount of military aid then is apparently much higher. The report cited the Ameri-

can administration's "efforts to hide the full amounts of aid and types of systems through bureaucratic manoeuvring"

Additionally, America has spent \$4.86bn on enhanced military operations in the region, which includes the costs of its campaign against the Houthis in Yemen, who, siding with the Palestinian population, are carrying out strikes against Israel. For the past one year, American aid to Israel has

been a combination of military financing and arms sales and transfers from the US stockpile, according to the report. A large part of the arsenal contains artillery shells and the 2,000pound bombs that Israel has used with devastating effect on the Palestinians of Gaza, turning their homes into rubble. Notwithstanding its hollow calls for a ceasefire, there has never been any serious intention or effort on part of the Biden administration to stop Israel's ongoing genocide in the Gaza Strip, where officially more than 41,000 people have been killed in the last one year. While occasionally raising concerns over Israel's indiscriminate killings of civilians and briefly pausing the flow of some heavy bombs, Washington has refused to stipulate conditions for US military aid, despite growing international protests. It has remained silent over the wanton butchery currently going on in Lebanon, where more than 1,000 people have died in devastating Israeli air strikes that have used US-supplied bombs.

Being the most critical US ally in the Middle East, Israel is the biggest recipient of US military aid in history since 1959. Apart the current administration's massive military aid, there is overwhelming bipartisan sup-port for the Zionist regime in the US Congress. No US administration can afford to defy the powerful Israeli lobby that virtually controls Congress. At the height of this genocidal war, the Israeli prime minister, whose arrest warrant as a war criminal was requested

by the International Crimi-

nal Court prosecutor some months ago, was invited to address the joint session of Congress in July, where he received repeated standing ovations by legislators from both sides of the aisle as he justified his genocidal war calling it a "clash between barbarism and

civilisation" He rejected the twostate solution making it clear that Israel was not seeking to resettle Gaza. Only a handful of progressive legislators abstained in protest. The growing sentiment among the younger generation of Americans against the war is not likely to have any effect on Washington's unqualified support for Israel's genocidal war.

Many analysts agree that it is Israel that effectively runs American foreign policy. Israel's powerful influence on US policy is well described in The Israel Lobby and US Foreign Policy, a seminal book authored by two eminent US university professors and originally published in

"It is difficult to talk about the lobby's influence on American foreign policy, at least in the mainstream media in the United States without being accused of anti-Semitism..." the book . Not only does it [the lobby] exert significant influence over the policy process in Democratic and Republican administrations alike, but it is even more powerful on Capitol Hill.'

Writing in the New Yorker in 2005, journalist Jeffrey Goldberg recounted a meeting with an official of the American Israel Public Affairs Committee, who putting a napkin in front of him, said, "You see this napkin? In 24 hours, we could have the signatures of 70 senators on this napkin. The unanimous support for aid to Israel in the Congress is a testimony of the influence and power of AIPAC on Congress, irrespective of whichever party wins the presiden-

With just a few weeks left for the next election, there is no possibility of any change in Washington's unqualified backing for Is-

# Weather worries

According to scientists, for 800,000 years of Earth's existence the amount of carbon in the atmosphere did not exceed 300 ppm (parts per million).

Then in 1911, the amount of carbon in the atmosphere exceeded that level for the first time. Since then, carbon in the atmosphere has only been increasing. This year, carbon levels in the atmosphere exceeded 425 ppm. Increased carbon di-

oxide and the effects of greenhouse gases have led to a host of problems that impact human health. The higher temperatures are especially dangerous for vulnerable populations such as children and pregnant women. Premature births, a leading cause of early childhood deaths, go up during heatwaves.

The temperature in many parts of Pakistan this summer was above 40 degrees Celsius. And going by the pattern over the past few years, the trend is likely to persist. This suggests that climate change produces a distinct and special risk to children, especially those who live in the hot regions of the world

According to Unicef, one-third of all children globally experience four to five heatwaves in a year. It goes without saying that risks to their health may be exacerbated by poverty. In fact, climate change can adversely affect crop output, resulting in food insecurity and poor nutrition

for growing bodies. Climate change can also impact levels of air pollution and is believed to aggravate smog. Studies suggest that symptoms of asthma and other allergies are increasing in children, especially in poorer countries, leading to non-attendance at school.

And it is not just on account of illness that children face disruptions in their education schedule: every year, millions of children face weeks of school closure due to adverse weather conditions, including intense heat and heavy rain, as we have witnessed Excessive heat also means

that children cannot play outdoors, and are subjected to a crowded environment inside their homes, which are often poorly venti-

Temperatures are more acute in large cities, such as Karachi and Lahore, where the proliferation of concrete and asphalt surfaces has created the urban heat island effect that is, the temperature in these cities is often several degrees hotter than in the adjoining areas. Summer has thus become a time of dread, with temperatures continuing to soar year after year, with no respite in sight.

choices before parents in the hotter months, especially as children are particularly vulnerable to heatstroke. Of late, there has been some awareness of the matter, but are hospitals and clinics doing enough to treat young victims of heatstroke? Special wards are needed in the summer months that are equipped to treat children and babies who have suffered the effects of intense

Similarly, can medical outlets cope with the rising cases of allergies and respiratory illnesses? Developing the requisite facilities and training staff to operate them efficiently requires advance planning and funding. It is simply not enough to have a climate change ministry. It is necessary to address what the weather means for our children's everyday health.

Then there is the matter of mental health. A recent qualitative study carried out by Shazia Soomro, Dianen Zhou and Iftikhar Charan focuses on the psychological effects of rising temperatures on Pakistani children, particularly the rise of "climate anxiety".

According to the authors, children are a vulnerable population because they are still growing physically and intellectually, and the increased tribulation and uncertainty caused by climate-related factors means that they can suffer a more permanent impact. Naturally, children in poverty-stricken and under-

resourced areas are the most susceptible, although each child is affected differently, depending on a host of circumstances.

The study, published in the African Journal of Reproductive Health, looks at how extreme weather events affect the educational achievement of Pakistani children. These weather events include heatwaves, droughts, and heavy rainfall. While the jury may be out on the exact parameters of an 'extreme' weather event, Pakistan has suffered heavy monsoon rains that have far exceeded expectations for some years now.

The authors of the There seem to be few study found that even accounting for changes in the river flow and patterns of snowmelt, the severity of the new monsoon could only be attributed to climate change. This was true also of the devastating flood of 2022, which affected 33 million people in the country.

The study found that extreme weather events were causing attachment disorders, depression, panic attacks, phobias and anxiety among children. In addition to these mood disorders, a regressive impact on children's ability to control their emotions was also observed; many of the youngsters experienced cognitive deficits, behaviour issues, learning difficulties, language development problems, adjustment challenges and generally poor academic performance. There is a nigh proportion of children whose mental health has been affected by climate change. Children affected by the 2022 floods still report anxiety displacement stress, depression and sleep disorders. While the study focuses on a small cohort, it is likely that the results seen among them can be extrapolated to the at least 670,000 children that the authors say were affected by the floods. Interestingly, many spoke about the trauma of the flash floods that occur in Sindh every year. Many also noted how isolated they feel from the natural environment because they live in such heavily urbanised areas.

He quoted that according to the American Society of Phytopathology, it is estimated that economic losses in the agricultural sector due to nematodes represent 14 percent of the worldwide crop yield losses, which is almost US\$125 billion annually, caused by over 4100 species of plant parasitic nematodes.

He said that the effect of nematodes on agriculture is often underestimated as they produce non-specific symptoms that are often confused with situations of water stress, nutritional disorders, soil fertility problems, or other secondary fungal or bacterial infections that are usually favored by the action of these organisms.

Dr Soomro added that the changes in research are unlimited in view of the advances in the technologies used and the new challenges the field of Plant Nematology faces. Some of the greatest challenges that humanity will have to face in the future are related to nematodes. These include scarce water resources, pest control, intensive agriculture, and crop diseases.
