5 students & one police cop among 9 martyred, 33 injured in Mastung blast

CM pledges to take revenge of blood of innocent children & persons, fight terrorism together

Independent Report QUETTA: As many as nine persons including five students and one police cop were killed while 33 others

-mostly children-got injured in a remote control bomb explosion near a Girls High school in Mastung city on Friday morning. The reports reaching

here suggested that the remote control explosive device was planted in a mo-

torcycle near the Girls High the spot of explosion and Ahmed Baloch, at least 30 school which went off with a big bang.

As a result of the blast, five children, a police constable and a passerby were killed while 35 others mostly children -injured.

Two of the injured succumbed to serious wounds in the hospitals. Soon after the blast, the

police, local administration and rescue teams reached

started rescue operation. The bodies of deceased children and others and injured persons were shifted to the local hospitals of Mastung including District Headquarter Hospital and Nawab Ghous Bakhsh Memorial Hospital for treat-

tract was awarded after 4 vears. The transition had been extremely difficult and was met with resistance from unions, pressure groups with vested interests, media, and the corporation employees. Karachi had a different model, but it required massive budgetary support from the Government. Therefore, city managers decided to learn from all models and develop their own indigenous model that would fit into the present system of governance without burdening

the exchequer. It was clear that Rs 90 million was not a sufficient amount for a city that roughly catered to 5 million people annually. It was therefore decided to hand over the machinery, workshops, and contingent staff to the private concessionaire to reduce the burden on MCO and also on the private party. A recycling plant was amalgamated into the project to reduce pressure on dumping sites. It was also decided to impose a tax of Rs 8 per day per house so that door-to-door collection could be ensured, and "kachra kundis," or garbage tubs, could be cleared and converted into green areas and open spaces. The collection of tax has always been a challenge for municipalities. A city with over one hundred thousand trade shops only manages to collect from about 300 shops. This chal-

ing carbon credits internationally in lieu of clearing open spaces and converting them into green areas. This would allow the private concessionaire to generate revenue for buying new machinery and modernizing solid waste management. During this phase. another issue arose. Some private contractors were already collecting Rs 500 from each house in Ouetta in the name of door-to-door collection through young kids (often referred to as scavengers). They were taking away the green waste and recyclable materials to "kabaaris" and throwing away useless trash on the roads. It was decided to involve the police and magistrates as well to break this chain and take charge of the city's trash. It is unfortunate that Baela's recommendations move our policymakers with whom she has constantly engaged. An issue that has bothered me for decades now — Baela uneducation. It appears that government, society, educationists, school managers and even parents have hands 'tyrannise' the child and sacrifice the joys of childhood at the 'altar of the English language'.

Some government functionaries and academics now discreetly concede that an overwhelming majority of teachers are not proficient in English and that affects their pedagogic performance. Yet no initiative has been taken to change the ambivalent language policy that is in place.

Neither is there any

advocacy campaign to create awareness of the stupidity of imposing the English language on young children in the initial phase of their schooling. Not being familiar with it they are overawed by it. If the mother tongue or the language of the environment is used in early childhood and a few years of primary education, children will find school to be a friendly and welcoming place. The transition to another language will be painless when the changeover is gradual and takes place at an appropriate stage when the student is psychologically and mentally ready for it.

There is something seriously wrong with the hybrid pedagogy which allows the teacher to speak in Urdu, while the books are in English, and the students are expected to speak, read and write in English. This pattern will continue until the language factor is taken into account. It may be added that the child will be dumbed and will rote learn and never be able to

think critically. The fact is that we are regressing. Until last year, Sindh had, relatively speaking, a sane language in education policy:

the medium of instruction in all public sector schools was Sindhi and Urdu in areas inhabited by Sindhi and Urdu speakers respectively. Each community learned the other's language as a compulsory second language. The private schools, however, were inadvisably left to their

Today, under the unwritten orders of a district education officer, English is the medium of instruction in specified public sector schools in District South of Karachi. We shall never know about the di-

sastrous impact of this policy because the everobliging examination board is infamous for producing desired results that are not a valid assessment of candidates. As a consequence, education has lost all credibility. The focus is now on qua-ntity. The 26 million out-of-school child-ren in Pakistan have

Anti-polio efforts in Gaza

Muhammad Moazzam Tauheed Polio remains endemic in only two countries: Paki-

stan and Afghanistan. Despite global efforts, both nations still struggle with transmission, driven by misinformation, rumours, and conspiracy theories. Claims that the polio vaccine causes infertility or is part of foreign plots have fuelled vaccine hesitancy, preventing parents from vaccinating their children and delaying eradication. Anti-vaccine narratives, often spread by groups with local influence, lead many to refuse vaccinations, putting entire communities at

In contrast, regions that have successfully eradicated polio, such as Africa, Europe, and the Americas, do not experience the health crises predicted by conspiracy theorists. Instead, these countries benefit from healthier populations, free from the dangers of polio-induced paralysis. Despite ongoing

conflict, public health efforts in Gaza have managed to overcome vaccine opposition. In July, after reports emerged of polio strains found in Gaza due to damage to infrastructure and the destructive effects of war, the Israeli army began vaccinating soldiers in Gaza to prevent the spread of polio. Meanwhile, Palestinian officials, organisations, and resistance factions encouraged the public to vaccinate and reject conspiracy theories. Palestinians, despite long-standing oppression and political challenges, have prioritised public health by supporting vaccina-

Reports from independent sources, such as the Euro-Mediterranean Human Rights Monitor, rate of nearly 97 per cent. indicate that Israeli ac-

tions have hindered vaccination efforts in Gaza. Nevertheless, both Palestinians and Israelis acknowledge the importance of polio prevention.

This raises a critical question: if Palestinians facing severe challenges can overcome scepticism and embrace polio vaccination, why does hesitancy persist in Pakistan and Afghanistan? Global eradication efforts have demonstrated the power of vaccination, reducing polio cases by over 99 per cent worldwide. Both the inactivated polio vaccine (IPV) and the oral polio su--pported and particivaccine (OPV) are proven safe and effective, with extremely rare complica-

Nations that have eradicated polio do not exceeded targets. In conface the health crises feared by anti-vaccine groups. Instead, they reap the benefits of a polio-free population, while unvaccinated communities continue to suffer from polio's devastating cial to improve sanitation, impact. Given these facts, it is essential to ask: if polio-free regions thrive without the feared complications, what continues to fuel vaccine hesitancy in Pakistan and Afghanistan? Vaccine resistance remains a significant barrier, leaving children vulnerable to this preventable disease.

The presence of polio in these countries underscores the urgent need to combat misinformation and prioritise the people's well-being. Addressing vaccine hesitancy requires tackling deep-seated mistrust and educational gaps.

Education is critical in forming a foundation for accepting public health initiatives. Despite facing occupation, an environment of apartheid, and conflict, the Palestinian territories maintain a high literacy comparable to developed

37pc and 62pc, respectively.

Gender disparity in education is minimal in the Palestinian territories, where education for girls is robust, and female literacy nearly equals male literacy. However, in Pakistan and Afghanistan, particularly in the rural areas, significant gender gaps persist. This educational disparity also affects public health.

Palestinian fa--milies pated in the polio vaccin-ation campaign, with the World Health Organisation noting that Gaza's polio vaccinations trast, efforts in both Pakistan and Afghanistan encounter numerous challenges, which include misinformation and logistical issues. Beyond delivering vaccines, it is cruaccess to clean water, and nutrition to bolster immunity and reduce vulnerability to polio.

Combating vaccine hesitancy demands dismantling myths and conspiracy theories. In Pakistan, the government enforces strict tax policies, penalising non-filers and even blocking phone SIM cards. However, similar measures are not applied to polio campaigns. Incentivising families who vaccinate and penalising refusals may improve campaign out-

Public health campaigns can succeed even in conflict zones when focused on protecting the population. By following Gaza's example, Pakistan and Afghanistan can strengthen their efforts, dispel misinformation, and ultimately join the ranks of nations that have eradicated polio. -- Cour-



At least 46 Palestinians killed in Israeli strikes, hospital hit, says Gaza ministry

Monitoring Desk CAIRO: At least 46 Palestinians were killed in Israeli military strikes across the Gaza Strip mostly in the north where one attack hit a hospital, torching medical supplies and disrupting operations, the enclave's health officials said.

Israel's military has accused the Palestinian militant group Hamas of using Kamal Adwan Hospital in Beit Lahiya for military purposes and said "dozens of terrorists" have been hiding there. Health officials and Hamas deny the charge.

Later on Thursday, an Israeli airstrike on two houses in the Nuseirat camp in central Gaza killed at least 16 Palestinians, medics at Al-Awda Hospital in the camp told Reuters. The dead included a paramedic and two local journalists, they added.

Northern Gaza, where Israel said in January it had dismantled Hamas' command structure, is currently

Chinese researchers develop AI model for military use on back of Meta's Llama

Monitoring Desk BEIJING: Top Chinese research institutions linked to the People's Liberation Army have used Meta's publicly available Llama model to develop an artificial intelligence (AI) tool for potential military applications, according to academic papers and analysts. In a June paper reviewed by Reuters, six Chinese researchers from three institutions, including two under the People's Liberation Army's (PLA) leading research body, the Academy of Military Science (AMS), detailed how they had used an early version of Meta's Llama as a base for what it calls "ChatBIT".

The researchers used an earlier Llama 2 13B large language model (LLM) that Meta META.O, incorporating their own parameters to construct a military-focused AI tool to gather and process intelligence, and offer

accurate and reliable information for operational decision-making. ChatBIT was fine-tuned and "optimised for dialogue and questionanswering tasks in the military field", the paper said It was found to outperform some other AI models that were roughly 90 per cent as capable as OpenAI's powerful ChatGPT-4. The researchers didn't elaborate on how they defined performance or specify whether the AI model had



MOSCOW: Russia has fined Google an eye-popoing 20 undecillion rubles \$2.5 decillion) for removing Russian state-run and government YouTube channels in the wake of the country's invasion of Ukraine in 2022.

In other words, Google faces a \$2.5 trillion trillion trillion bill from the country. Typed out in full, that figure is \$250,000,000,000,000

The total sum of legal claims against Google in Russia has reached two undecillion rubles, according to the Russian news outlet RBK, a figure higher than all the money in the world combined.

"I can't even pronounce this number, but it is more likely imbued with symbolism," Kremlin spokesman Peskov told Russian news agencies. "Google should not restrict the actions of our broadcasters, but it does. This should be a reason for Google's management to pay attention to this and correct the situation," he added. Death toll from Spanish floods climbs to 205 as shock turns to anger and frustration

initial shock gave way to anger, frustration and a wave of solidarity. Spanish emergency authorities said 202 of the victims were in the Valencia region alone, and officials warned that more rains were expected in the next days. The damage from the

storm Tuesday and Wednesday recalled the aftermath of a tsunami, with survivors left to pick up the pieces as they mourn loved ones lost in Spain's deadliest natural disaster in living memory. Many streets were still blocked by piledup vehicles and debris, in some cases trapping residents in their homes. Some places still don't have electricity, running water, or stable telephone connec-

"The situation is unbelievable. It's a disaster and there is very little help," said Emilio Cuartero, a resident of Masanasa, on the outskirts of Valencia. "We need machinery, cranes, so

that the sites can be accessed. We need a lot of help. And bread and water.'

In Chiva, residents were busy Friday clearing debris from mud-filled streets. The Valencian town received more rain in eight hours on Tuesday than it had in the preceding 20 months, and water overflowed a gully that crosses the town, tearing up roads and walls of houses. The mayor, Amparo

Fort, told RNE radio that "entire houses have disappeared, we don't know if there were people inside or not." So far 205 bodies have been recovered — 202 in Valencia, two in the Castilla La Mancha region and one more in Andalusia. Members of the security forces and soldiers are busy searching for an unknown number of missing people, many feared to still be trapped in wrecked vehicles or flooded garages. "I have been there all my life, all my memories are there, my parents lived there ... and now in one night it is all gone," Chiva resident Juan Vicente Pérez told The Associated Press near the
