The ban question

Renewed talk about banning one of the country's largest political parties shows nothing but the impoverishment of democratic thought in the Pakistani power elite. Following the forcible eviction of the PTI's latest protest from the federal capital, some entities have once again taken to describing the party as a 'terrorist outfit' and are seeking its proscription. Thankfully, the PPP, JUI and some others have opposed the measure, calling it a bad idea.

Others, perhaps most surprisingly the ANP, have made no bones about the fact that they wish to see the PTI removed from the picture completely. However, the parties that want the PTI to be banned do not seem to realise that they are veering away from the very 'democratic' credentials they claim to possess.

The recent round of condemnations started with the Balochistan Assembly, which passed a resolution on Thursday amid an opposition walkout calling to ban the party after its recent protests. Even by the sketchy standards of democracy in the province, this marked a new low. A similar resolution was also tabled in the Punjab Assembly, but this could not be passed with the same alacrity shown by the Balochistan Assembly, seemingly due to the PPP's opposition to the

Meanwhile, the federal cabinet considered imposing governor's rule in KP but again, saner minds seemed to have prevailed. None of this, however, is as disappointing for a student of Pakistan's political history as the fact that the heir of Khan Abdul Wali Khan, Aimal Wali, current chief of the Awami National Party, has also joined the chorus of those seeking a ban on PTI, going so far as to call it a "waste that should be

Among Pakistan's mainstream political parties, only two have been formally banned. One was the National Awami Party, led by Wali Khan, which was proscribed in 1975 but then came back to life as the ANP. The other was the Awami League, and the disastrous consequences of banning it led to the secession of East Pakistan. After usurping power, the dictator Gen Ziaul Haq attempted to ban the PPP too, and was instrumental in carving some factions out of it, but Bhutto's party also endured.

This history shows that bans simply do not work. All parties make mistakes, and the state and the citizenry can sometimes clash in violent ways. But this cannot be used to justify denying the public their constitutional right to organise under whatever banner they wish.

Instead of resorting to such arbitrary calls, all parties must focus on contributing positively towards the country's political culture by working to mitigate the divisions that exist between them and focusing on a negotiated solution. That is the only viable path forward in Pakistan's case.

Education reforms

Educational reforms in the country have, from the start, struggled with issues of inequality, access, quality, and relevance. Major challenges have included insufficient public spending on education, low literacy rates, gender disparity, an inadequate infrastructure, and poor delivery. The national education policy of 2009 was a landmark reform. It emphasised increasing literacy rates, improving quality, and addressing gender disparities. However, it was not fully implemented due to many hurdles. Pakistan is commit-

ted to the Education for All initiative, which aims at providing quality edu-cation to all children, particularly focusing on marginalised groups, and those living in rural areas. Pakistan also undertook higher education reforms, notably with the creation of the Higher Education Commission in 2002. The HEC was tasked with improving research, funding, and infrastructure for the universities. To bridge the gap between education and the workforce, Pakistan has focused on reforms to enhance technical and vocational education in order to improve employability and economic productivity.

The Federal Ministry of Education has introduced a curriculum and assessment reform through a systematic process to improve the quality of education. The HEC has introduced teacher education reform, which helped revamp preservice teacher education in the country. In order to assure the quality of teacher education, the HEC introduced accreditation for teacher education programmes. The Inter-Board Coordination Committee has intro-

aminations conducted by the Boards of Secondary and Intermediate Education in the country again a positive step towards improving the quality of education. The respective provincial governments have also made a number of interventions for improving the quality of education, but their impact is yet to be deter-

mined.

Sindh has introduced teacher licensing managed by the Sindh Teacher Education Development Authority. Although it is at the initial stage, it will help professionalise teacher education and improve teacher quality. Like other provinces, Sindh has also introduced a clusterbased continuous professional development policy, replacing the ad hoc approach to in-service teacher education. A critical mass of human resources, including master trainers, guide teachers, and subject coordinators, has been developed. They will be responsible for teachers' continuous professional development. Under this policy, the subject coordinators have been playing a pivotal role in conducting classroom observations and formative assessments for coaching purposes. The Sindh government has plans to develop the accreditation framework and the continuous professional development qualification

framework to promote quality teaching. In order to fully transform the education system, reforms should focus on increasing public spending, which needs to be substantial in order to ensure that schools are well-funded and equipped with modern teaching resources. There should be a nationteacher training and professional development. This would raise the qual- Dawn

Education for girls must be a priority, especially in the rural and tribal areas. Incentive programmes, community engagement, and awareness campaigns will help resolve cultural barriers. Using technology for remote learning and digital optimising educat-i--on platforms can reduce some of the geographical disparities in our ed--ucation system. Given the country's cultural and regional diversity, educational reforms should be localised to meet the unique needs of each region, while ensuring alignment with the larger national educational goals.

Educational reforms are normally projectdriven and funded by donors. Although there are some successes, the projects tend to function in isolation rather than integrating with the mainstream. Donor-driven projects normally take off late due to procedural matters. A thorough implementation plan seems to be the best solution for effective re-

The sustainability of education reforms and their impact have been a long-standing issue, which must be tackled. Any education reform must be part of the national/ regional education development plan based on a needs as-

Pakistan has an opportunity to reshape its education system into one that meets the needs of all its citizens. A balanced approach, combining investment in infrastructure, teacher quality, curriculum and assessment reform, and technology integration, could provide the foundation for a more equiwide initiative to improve table and effective education system in the country. -- Courtesy


